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# VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 23-234 of the Code of Virginia, relating to campus police departments; 3 memorandums of understanding; sexual assaults; reporting to local attorney for the Commonwealth.

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### Approved

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That § 23-234 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

8 § 23-234. Powers and duties; jurisdiction; mutual aid agreements; memoranda of 9 understanding.

10 A. A campus police officer appointed as provided in § 23-233 or appointed and activated pursuant to § 23-233.1 may exercise the powers and duties conferred by law upon police officers of cities, towns, or 11 12 counties, and shall be so deemed, including but not limited to the provisions of Chapters 5 (§ 19.2-52 et 13 seq.), 7 (§ 19.2-71 et seq.), and 23 (§ 19.2-387 et seq.) of Title 19.2, (i) upon any property owned or controlled by the relevant public or private institution of higher education, or, upon request, any property 14 15 owned or controlled by another public or private institution of higher education and upon the streets, sidewalks, and highways, immediately adjacent thereto, (ii) pursuant to a mutual aid agreement provided 16 17 for in § 15.2-1727 between the governing board of a public or private institution and such other institution of higher education, public or private, in the Commonwealth or adjacent political 18 19 subdivisions, (iii) in close pursuit of a person as provided in § 19.2-77, and (iv) upon approval by the 20 appropriate circuit court of a petition by the local governing body for concurrent jurisdiction in 21 designated areas with the police officers of the county, city, or town in which the institution, its satellite campuses, or other properties are located. The local governing body may petition the circuit court 22 23 pursuant only to a request by the local law-enforcement agency for concurrent jurisdiction.

24 B. All public or private institutions of higher education that have campus police forces established in 25 accordance with the provisions of this chapter shall enter in *into* and become a party to mutual aid 26 agreements with one or more of the following: (i) an adjacent local law-enforcement agency or (ii) the 27 Department of State Police, for the use of their joint forces, both regular and auxiliary, equipment, and 28 materials when needed in the investigation of any felony criminal sexual assault or medically unattended 29 death occurring on property owned or controlled by the institution of higher education or any death 30 resulting from an incident occurring on such property. Such mutual aid agreements shall include 31 provisions requiring either the campus police force or the agency with which it has established a mutual 32 aid agreement pursuant to this subsection, in the event that such police force or agency conducts an 33 investigation that involves a felony criminal sexual assault as set forth in Article 7 (§ 18.2-61 et seq.) of 34 Chapter 4 of Title 18.2 occurring on campus, in or on a noncampus building or property, or on public property, to notify the local attorney for the Commonwealth of such investigation within 48 hours of 35 36 beginning such investigation. Such notification shall not require a campus police force or the agency 37 with which it has established a mutual aid agreement to disclose identifying information about the 38 victim. The provisions of this section shall not prohibit a campus police force from requesting assistance 39 from any appropriate law-enforcement agency of the Commonwealth, even though a mutual aid 40 agreement has not been executed with that agency.

41 C. All public or private institutions of higher education that (i) do not have campus police forces 42 established in accordance with the provisions of this chapter and (ii) have security departments, rely on 43 municipal, county, or state police forces, or contract for security services from private parties pursuant to § 23-238 shall enter into and become a party to a memorandum of understanding with an adjacent 44 local law-enforcement agency or the Department of State Police (the Department) to require either such 45 local law-enforcement agency or the Department, in the event that such agency or the Department 46 conducts an investigation that involves a felony criminal sexual assault as set forth in Article 7 47 (§ 18.2-61 et seq.) of Chapter 4 of Title 18.2 occurring on campus, in or on a noncampus building or 48 49 property, or on public property, to notify the local attorney for the Commonwealth of such investigation 50 within 48 hours of beginning such investigation. Such notification shall not require the law-enforcement agency or the Department to disclose identifying information about the victim. 51 52

D. For purposes of this section:

53 "Campus" means (i) any building or property owned or controlled by an institution of higher 54 education located within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the institution and used by 55 the institution in direct support of, or in a manner related to, the institution's educational purposes, 56 including residence halls, and (ii) any building or property that is within or reasonably contiguous to

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- the area described in clause (i) that is owned by the institution but controlled by another person, is 57 58 frequently used by students, and supports institutional purposes, such as a food or other retail vendor.
- "Noncampus building or property" means (i) any building or property owned or controlled by a student organization that is officially recognized by an institution of higher education or (ii) any 59
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- building or property owned or controlled by an institution of higher education that is used in direct 61 support of, or in relation to, the institution's educational purposes, is frequently used by students, and is 62
- not within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the institution. 63
- "Public property" means all public property, including thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking 64
- 65 facilities, that is within the campus, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus.
