AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the House Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions

on January 30, 2014)

5 6 A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 22.1-217.2, by adding in Chapter 7 5 of Title 37.2 a section numbered 37.2-513, and by adding in Chapter 6 of Title 37.2 a section 8 numbered 37.2-616, relating to information for students with emotional and intellectual disabilities. 9

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-217.2, by adding in 10 Chapter 5 of Title 37.2 a section numbered 37.2-513, and by adding in Chapter 6 of Title 37.2 a 11 section numbered 37.2-616 as follows: 12

§ 22.1-217.2. Information about services for students with emotional and intellectual disabilities; 13 14 meetings.

15 A. Every local school division shall designate one or more staff members to receive training in and 16 information about the types of services provided by the local community services board or behavioral 17 health authority that will be available to students with intellectual disability or emotional disturbance who receive special education and related services in a public school or in a private day or residential 18 19 school for students with disabilities licensed by the Board and are expected to graduate with a special 20 diploma or certificate of program completion, upon such student's graduation from, aging out of, or 21 otherwise leaving public education.

22 B. The staff member described in subsection A shall take all reasonable steps to meet with every 23 student with intellectual disability or emotional disturbance who receive special education and related 24 services in a public school or in a private day or residential school for students with disabilities 25 licensed by the Board and who is expected to graduate with a special diploma or certificate of program completion who has not yet met with a representative of the community services board or behavioral 26 27 health authority as part of transition planning, and his parent or guardian, if he is less than 18 years of 28 age or is 18 years of age or older and he consents to their participation, at least one time during the 29 year prior to the student's graduation from, aging out of, or otherwise leaving public education to 30 provide the student, and his parent or guardian if present, with information about (i) the types of 31 services provided by the local community services board or behavioral health authority available to the 32 student upon his graduation from, aging out of, or otherwise leaving public education and (ii) the 33 process by which the student may begin receiving services upon graduation from, aging out of, or 34 otherwise leaving public education. Representatives of the local community services board or behavioral 35 health authority shall participate in the meeting if the student's parent or guardian, or the student if he 36 is 18 years of age or older, consent to such participation. 37

§ 37.2-513. Information for certain students; participation in student meetings.

38 A. Every community services board shall provide representatives of every local school division served 39 by the community services board training in and information about the types of services available to 40 students with intellectual disability or emotional disturbance who receive special education and related 41 services in a public school or in a private day or residential school for students with disabilities 42 licensed by the Board of Education and are expected to graduate with a special diploma or certificate of program completion upon such student's graduating from, aging out of, or otherwise leaving public 43 44 education and the processes by which such students may connect to and begin to receive such services 45 upon graduating from, aging out of, or otherwise leaving public education.

B. Every community services board shall ensure that at least one employee or representative of the 46 47 community services board is available, in person, to participate in meetings between local school **48** division representatives and a student with intellectual disability or emotional disturbance who receives 49 special education and related services in a public school or in a private day or residential school for 50 students with disabilities licensed by the Board of Education and is expected to graduate with a special 51 diploma or certificate of program completion, upon graduating from, aging out of or otherwise leaving public education, and his parent or guardian, where appropriate, in accordance with § 22.1-217.2. 52 53

§ 37.2-616. Information for certain students; participation in student meetings.

54 A. Every behavioral health authority shall provide representatives of every local school division served by the behavioral health authority training in and information about the types of services 55 available to students with intellectual disability or emotional disturbance who receive special education 56 and related services in a public school or in a private day or residential school for students with 57 disabilities licensed by the Board of Education and are expected to graduate with a special diploma or 58 59 certificate of program completion, upon such student's graduating from, aging out of, or otherwise

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60 leaving public education, and the processes by which such students may connect to and begin to receive61 such services upon graduating from, aging out of, or otherwise leaving public education.

62 B. Every behavioral health authority shall ensure that at least one employee or representative of the 63 behavioral health authority is available, in person, to participate in meetings between local school

64 division representatives and a student with intellectual disability or emotional disturbance who receives

65 special education and related services in a public school or in a private day or residential school for

66 students with disabilities licensed by the Board of Education and is expected to graduate with a special

67 diploma or certificate of program completion, upon graduating from, aging out of, or otherwise leaving

68 public education, and his parent or guardian, where appropriate, in accordance with § 22.1-217.2.
