9 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, a majority of the members elected to 10 each house agreeing, That the following amendment to the Constitution of Virginia be, and the same hereby is, proposed and referred to the General Assembly at its first regular session held after the next 11 general election of members of the House of Delegates for its concurrence in conformity with the 12 provisions of Section 1 of Article XII of the Constitution of Virginia, namely: 13

14 Repeal Section 15-A of Article I of the Constitution of Virginia as follows: 15

ARTICLE I

**BILL OF RIGHTS** 

17 Section 15-A. Marriage.

18 That only a union between one man and one woman may be a marriage valid in or recognized by 19 this Commonwealth and its political subdivisions.

20 This Commonwealth and its political subdivisions shall not create or recognize a legal status for 21 relationships of unmarried individuals that intends to approximate the design, qualities, significance, or 22 effects of marriage. Nor shall this Commonwealth or its political subdivisions create or recognize 23 another union, partnership, or other legal status to which is assigned the rights, benefits, obligations, 24 qualities, or effects of marriage.
