10	WHEREAS, Article XI, Section 1 of the Constitution of Virginia states that it shall be the policy of
11	the Commonwealth to conserve, develop, and utilize its natural resources and protect its waters for the
12	benefit, enjoyment, and general welfare of the people of the Commonwealth; and
13	WHEREAS, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) has reported potential risk to the water
14	supply, including groundwater, given changes in population and demand for water for industrial,
15	recreational, and residential use; and
16 17	WHEREAS, recent withdrawals of groundwater in eastern Virginia may have contributed to topographical and hydrological changes, including lower water tables and land subsidence, and higher
17	risk of saltwater contamination of groundwater; and
19	WHEREAS, DEQ has appropriated approximately \$40 million annually for water protection
20	functions, including planning, permitting, and compliance; now, therefore, be it
21	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and
22	Review Commission be directed to study Virginia's management of groundwater resources.
23	In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) shall (i) assess
24	the extent to which groundwater consumption is unsustainable, the potential effects of any unsustainable
25 26	consumption, and the risk of overconsumption in the future; (ii) assess the effectiveness of state and
20 27	local water resource planning, particularly with regard to groundwater, including the role state and local plans play in water withdrawal permitting; (iii) examine the adequacy of current funding and staffing
28	levels for managing Virginia's water resources; (iv) consider the need for strategies and practices to
2 9	preserve or increase the amount of groundwater available for future consumption; and (v) review any
30	other issues and make recommendations as appropriate.
31	Technical assistance shall be provided to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission by
32	DEQ, the State Water Control Board, and the State Department of Health. All agencies of the
33	Commonwealth, local governments, and water resource authorities shall provide assistance to JLARC for
34	this study, upon request.
35 36	The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its meetings by November 30,
30 37	2015, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2016 Regular Session of
37 38	the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the Joint Legislative Audit and
39	Review Commission intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its
40	findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary
41	and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated
42	Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General
43	Assembly's website.
