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10	WHEREAS, law-enforcement officers are the Commonwealth's first responders for a wide variety of
11 12	emergencies; and WHEREAS, law-enforcement duties include customer service, traffic control, service of process,
13	making arrests, court security, handling of evidence, and crisis intervention; and
14	WHEREAS, many of these duties require special skills and tactics that can only be acquired through
15	regularly offered training; and
16	WHEREAS, a regular, uniform program of training will put the Commonwealth's law-enforcement
17	officers in a better position to protect the citizens of Virginia and their property; now, therefore, be it
18 19	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Department of Criminal Justice Services be requested to study the sufficiency of funding for training law-enforcement officers,
20	including crisis intervention training.
$\overline{2}1$	In conducting its study, the Department of Criminal Justice Services shall (i) review all sources of
22	funds available to train Virginia's law-enforcement officers, including federal and state grants, asset
23	forfeitures, and private sources of funding; (ii) identify funds for law-enforcement training currently
24	available that the Commonwealth is not using, if any; (iii) identify core training programs or curricula
25 26	that should be made available to all law-enforcement officers and determine the percentage of Virginia law-enforcement officers who have completed such programs; (iv) estimate the cost for additional
20 27	Virginia law-enforcement officers to complete such core programs; and (v) recommend ways in which to
28	make specialized training, including crisis intervention training, accessible to more law-enforcement
29	officers.
30	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department of Criminal Justice
31	Services for this study, upon request.
32 33	The Department of Criminal Justice Services shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2015, and
33 34	shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary
35	and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated
36	Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2016
37	Regular Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
