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15101724D **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 637** 1 2 Offered January 14, 2015 3 Prefiled January 14, 2015 4 Directing the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission to study the Commonwealth's Medicaid 5 program. Report. 6 Patrons-Landes, Garrett and Greason 7 8 Referred to Committee on Rules 9 10 WHEREAS, the Commonwealth's program of medical assistance services, also known as the Medicaid program, is the largest program in the Commonwealth's budget, accounting for more than \$8 11 billion in combined state and federal funds in Fiscal Year 2014; and 12 WHEREAS, state and federal appropriations for the Medicaid program have increased by 85 percent 13 14 over the past decade, and more than 1.1 million Virginians are now enrolled in the program; and 15 WHEREAS, elderly Virginians and Virginians with disabilities represent a minority of enrollees in 16 the Medicaid program but account for the majority of expenditures for medical assistance services, and generally receive services through a fee-for-service rather than a managed care system; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the Commonwealth's Medicaid program has become increasingly complex as coverage 19 has expanded to include services related to long-term care, behavioral health, and developmental 20 disabilities: and 21 WHEREAS, no comprehensive and analytical review of the effectiveness and efficiency of the 22 Commonwealth's Medicaid program has been undertaken; and 23 WHEREAS, in light of budgetary pressures facing states across the nation, promising models of care 24 and administrative processes have been implemented to lower costs associated with medical assistance 25 services while maintaining and improving patient outcomes; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and 26 27 Review Commission be directed to study the Commonwealth's Medicaid program. In conducting its 28 study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall (i) analyze the impact of major cost 29 drivers on the growth of Medicaid program expenditures; (ii) identify highest-cost Medicaid recipients 30 and services and assess whether opportunities exist to improve the cost-effectiveness of health care 31 delivery; (iii) examine the efficiency of the administration of the Commonwealth's Medicaid program, including financial processes and controls and the recovery of third-party payments, and review the 32 implementation status of recommendations made in its 2011 report, "Mitigating the Risk of Improper 33 Payments in the Virginia Medicaid Program," on improper payments and other reports related to 34 improving efficiency and cost-effectiveness; (iv) identify evidence-based practices and strategies that 35 36 have been successfully adopted in other states and that could be used in the Commonwealth to provide 37 cost-effective care, strengthen patient outcomes, and maximize the efficiency and integrity of internal 38 processes; and (v) review other relevant issues and make recommendations as appropriate. 39 Technical assistance shall be provided to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission by the 40 Department of Medical Assistance Services. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission for this study, upon request. 41 42 The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2015, and for the second year by November 30, 2016, and the chairman shall submit to 43 the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and 44 45 recommendations no later than the first day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. Each executive summary shall state whether the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and 46 47 48 recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summaries and reports 49 shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's 50 51 website.
