WHEREAS, a man of faith, Jack Hamm enjoyed fellowship and worship as a member of Mount Carmel Christian Church in Meadowview; and

WHEREAS, Jack Hamm will be greatly missed and fondly remembered by Virginia, his wife of 48 years; his children, Rick, Mikel, Jordan, and Alan, and their families; and many other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby note with great sadness the loss of Jack R. Hamm of Meadowview, who was born and lived his entire life in Washington County and was a farmer, a farm machinery repair technician, a volunteer firefighter, a man of faith, a foster parent to more than 100 children, and a devoted husband and father; and, be it
