WHEREAS, Sara Collins shared her wealth of historical knowledge freely by publishing numerous articles and hosting workshops and seminars; in 1997, she received the Pogue Award from Oral History in the Mid-Atlantic Region for her contributions to the field of oral history; and

WHEREAS, Sara Collins enjoyed fellowship and worship with the community as an active member of Arlington United Methodist Church; she served as the church librarian, played violin in the orchestra, and had led the church's 150th anniversary celebration; and

WHEREAS, Sara Collins will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by her children, Catherine and Kyle, and their families and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby note with great sadness the loss of Sara Jean Dobie Collins, a respected historian and beloved member of the Arlington County community; and, be it
