WHEREAS, passionately devoted to making a difference in the lives of his students, Bill Stanton's purpose in life was to inspire others to aspire and to seek out the talents and gifts of his pupils; he was frequently recognized as an outstanding teacher and was especially drawn to the Woodville Model Elementary School community; and
