WHEREAS, while working at the Department of Accounts, Fern Spencer was credited with having

Auditor, and the accounts payable functions for the Department of Planning and Budget and the
Department of the Treasury; and

WHEREAS, as the founding chief financial and investment officer of the Virginia529 College
Savings Plan, Fern Spencer was responsible for all accounting, program operations budgeting,
investment management oversight, and financial compliance and reporting functions for the nation's
largest Section 529 college savings plan; and

WHEREAS, after 28 years of service to the Commonwealth, Fern Spencer retired as chief financial
 officer of the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts and treasurer of the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts
 Foundation; and

WHEREAS, Fern Spencer also worked at New York Private Bank & Trust as a vice president and
 chief financial officer, and she served as a principal and chief compliance officer of HPM Partners LLC,
 a subsidiary of Emigrant Bancorp; and
