3 Commending Congressional Schools of Virginia. 4

6 WHEREAS, during the 2014 - 2015 academic year, Congressional Schools of Virginia in Falls 7 Church celebrates its 75th anniversary of preparing children to embrace the opportunities and responsibilities they will face as global citizens; and 8

9 WHEREAS, Congressional Schools of Virginia was founded in Arlington in 1939 for children ages three to five, and added grades one through four a year later; by the 1950s, Congressional School 10 educated pupils through the eighth grade; and 11

WHEREAS, during the first 20 years of its existence, Congressional Schools moved several times; in 12 13 1960, having grown to include grades nine through 12, a new campus opened on Sleepy Hollow Road 14 in Falls Church; and

15 WHEREAS, in 1979, when the institution was reorganized, its name was changed to Congressional 16 Schools of Virginia, and the upper school was phased out in the mid-1980s, with the final class graduating in 1987; today, the school, which serves children from infancy through eighth grade, is 17 18 thriving; and

19 WHEREAS, the diverse student population at the Congressional Schools of Virginia is part of an 20 enriching learning environment; additionally, the school works to develop a strong partnership with 21 parents; and

WHEREAS, the modern facilities of the Congressional Schools of Virginia include a 22 23 gymnasium/auditorium and two technology centers; each classroom has an interactive whiteboard and 24 many interactive media and virtual classroom tools; and

25 WHEREAS, Congressional Schools of Virginia features early childhood, lower, and middle school programs in a dynamic learning environment; the school also has summer camp programs with a variety 26 27 of academic, athletic, and other specialty offerings; and

WHEREAS, the courses offered at Congressional Schools of Virginia continually evolve and expand; 28 29 speech and drama classes have recently been introduced in the middle school, and students also can 30 participate in many extracurricular activities, clubs, and teams; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, That Congressional Schools of Virginia in Falls Church 31 hereby be commended on the occasion of its 75th anniversary during the 2014 - 2015 academic year; 32 33 and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution 34 35 for presentation to Janet F. Marsh, executive director of the Congressional Schools of Virginia, as an 36 expression of the House of Delegates' congratulations and admiration for its many years of success in 37 preparing children to embrace the opportunities and responsibilities they will face as global citizens and 38 best wishes for the future.
