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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 22.1 a chapter numbered 25, consisting
12	of sections numbered 22.1-362 through 22.1-370, as follows:
13	CHAPTER 25.
14	RICHMOND CITY PUBLIC SCHOOLS LEARNING EXCELLENCE BY ALIGNING PUBLIC SCHOOLS
15	COMMISSION.
16	§ 22.1-362. Richmond City Public Schools Learning Excellence by Aligning Public Schools
17	Commission established; membership.
18	A. The Richmond City Public Schools Learning Excellence by Aligning Public Schools Commission
19	(the Commission) is hereby established as a political subdivision of the Commonwealth, with such
20	powers as are set forth in this chapter.
21	B. The Commission shall consist of seven members. Two members shall be appointed by the
22	Richmond City School Board, two members shall be appointed by the Richmond City Council, two
23	members shall be appointed by the Mayor of Richmond, and one member, who shall serve as chairman,
24	shall be elected by the appointed members. The Commission shall elect a vice-chairman from among its
25	members. Members shall be appointed for terms of three years. Appointments to fill vacancies, other
26	than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same
27	manner as the original appointments. All members may be reappointed.
28	C. Commission members shall be appointed based on their recognized qualifications in the fields of
29	public education, education administration, or facilities management. The Commission chairman shall be
30	nominated and elected based on his recognized qualifications in the fields of public education or
31	education administration. No residency requirements shall be imposed on the members. No Commission
32	member, including the chairman, shall be a current employee of the City of Richmond, the Richmond
33	City School Board, or any authority or subdivision thereof.
34	D. Members of the Commission, including the chairman, shall serve without compensation. Members
35	shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their
36	duties in the work of the Commission. All such expenses shall be paid from existing appropriations to or
37	received by the Commission or, if the Commission is unfunded, by the Richmond City School Board.
38	E. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The Commission shall meet at the call of
39	the chairman or whenever a majority of the members so request.
40	§ 22.1-363. Functions and duties.
41	The Commission shall perform the following functions and duties:
42	1. Establish standards for the evaluation of the facilities of Richmond City Public Schools, including
43	population, suitability, and physical condition. Such standards shall be consistent with § 22.1-138 and
44 45	relevant Board regulations;
45	2. Review the policies, procedures, and performance of Richmond City Public Schools to the extent
46	necessary to carry out the Commission's evaluation of the facilities of Richmond City Public Schools;
47 48	3. Review and evaluate existing reports and recommendations on the facilities of Richmond City Public Schools;
40 49	4. Evaluate the facilities of Richmond City Public Schools against the standards adopted by the
49 50	<i>Commission;</i>
50 51	5. Provide quarterly interim progress reports to the Richmond City School Board, the Richmond City
52	Council, and the Mayor of Richmond or more frequently if the Commission deems necessary; and
53	6. Provide a final report to the Richmond City School Board, the Richmond City Council, and the
55 54	Mayor of Richmond no later than December 1, 2016, that shall include short-term, medium-term, and
55	long-term recommendations for school facility efficiencies, utilization, upgrades, and any other items as
56	the Commission may deem necessary to improve the effectiveness, efficiency, and academic performance
57	of Richmond City Public Schools.
58	§ 22.1-364. Public hearings and public information program required.

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59 In carrying out its functions and duties, the Commission shall:

60 1. Undertake a program to provide the public with accurate and timely information regarding the 61 Commission's activities:

62 2. Undertake at least one site visit to each school facility owned, operated, or proposed to be owned 63 or operated by Richmond City Public Schools; and

64 $\overline{3}$. Conduct at least one public hearing devoted to each school facility owned, operated, or proposed 65 to be owned or operated by Richmond City Public Schools. Such public hearing shall be conducted either at the facility in question or, if impractical, at a site located nearby and convenient for the 66 67 public. 68

§ 22.1-365. Executive director; staff support; location.

69 A. From such funds as may be appropriated or received, the Commission may appoint an executive 70 director, who may employ an administrative assistant. The Commission may determine the duties of such 71 executive director and administrative assistant and shall fix salaries and compensation from such funds 72 as may be appropriated or received.

73 B. Additional staff shall be provided by Richmond City Public Schools and the City of Richmond as 74 necessary to enable the Commission to perform its duties as set forth in this chapter. Any such staff 75 shall report to the executive director.

76 C. The Commission's offices shall be housed in Richmond City Hall or such other facility as may be 77 made available.

78 § 22.1-366. Application for and acceptance of gifts and grants.

79 The Commission may apply for, accept, and expend gifts, grants, or donations from public or private 80 sources to enable it to carry out its objectives.

81 § 22.1-367. Cooperation of departments and divisions.

All departments and divisions of the City of Richmond and the Richmond City School Board shall 82 83 cooperate with the Commission and provide assistance, upon request.

§ 22.1-368. Annual audits. 84

85 The Commission shall be audited annually, and a report of such audit shall be provided to the Richmond City School Board, the Richmond City Council, and the Mayor of Richmond. Such audit may 86 be conducted by either an independent auditor contracted by the Commission or the Richmond City 87 88 Auditor.

89 § 22.1-369. Richmond City Public Schools Learning Excellence by Aligning Public Schools Trust 90 created.

91 A. The City of Richmond shall create the Richmond City Public Schools Learning Excellence by 92 Aligning Public Schools Trust (the Trust) for the purpose of funding the recommendations of the 93 Commission.

94 B. The Trust shall be administered by the City of Richmond subject to detailed policies and 95 procedures approved by both the Richmond City Council and the Richmond City School Board. 96 Expenditures from the Trust shall be made only by appropriation by the Richmond City Council.

97 C. Funding of the Trust shall occur only if the recommendations of the Commission are adopted by 98 the Richmond City School Board.

99 D. Assets transferred to the Trust may include surplus real property, surplus property, cash, cash 100 equivalents, or any other type of financial asset.

E. Donations, grants, and other governmental and nongovernmental funds shall be deposited to the 101 102 Trust with approval of the Richmond City Council.

F. Title to any real property identified as surplus in the Commission's final report, or the net cash 103 derived from the sale thereof, shall be transferred to the Trust upon adoption of the report by the 104 Richmond City School Board. The net earnings generated by such property, if any, shall be retained by 105 106 the Trust.

G. From such funds as shall be appropriated by the Richmond City Council, real property 107 108 transferred to the Trust shall be maintained by the Trust.

109 H. In cooperation with the City of Richmond, the Trust shall endeavor to dispose of real property 110 transferred to it through sale, lease, redevelopment, or reuse. In doing so, the Trust shall discharge its duties with the care, skill, prudence, and diligence under the circumstances then prevailing that a 111 prudent person acting in a like capacity and familiar with such matters would use in the conduct of an 112 113 enterprise of a like character and with like aims.

I. The Richmond City Council may appropriate such additional funds to the Trust as it deems 114 115 appropriate.

J. Assets of the Trust shall not revert to the City of Richmond or the Richmond City School Board 116 but shall be carried forward on the books of the Trust. However, upon dissolution of the Trust, assets of 117 the Trust shall revert to the Richmond City School Board. 118

119 K. Assets of the Trust shall be used only to implement the recommendations of the Richmond City Public Schools Learning Excellence by Aligning Public Schools Commission. 120

- 121 L. Monthly reports on the assets and expenditures of the Trust shall be provided to the Richmond 122 City School Board, the Richmond City Council, and the Mayor of Richmond.
- 123 *M. The Trust shall be audited annually, and a report shall be provided to the Richmond City School* 124 Board, the Richmond City Council, and the Mayor of Richmond.
- 125 N. The City of Richmond shall dissolve the Trust upon a majority vote of both the Richmond City 126 Council and the Richmond City School Board.
- 127 § 22.1-370. Sunset.
- **128** *A. The Commission created in this chapter shall expire on July 1, 2017.*
- 129 B. The Trust created in § 22.1-369 shall expire on July 1, 2017, unless (i) the report of the
- 130 Commission is adopted by the Richmond City School Board and (ii) initial asset transfers are made to
- **131** the Trust by July 1, 2017.
