10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 22.1-270 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 22.1-270. Preschool physical examinations.
13	A. No pupil shall be admitted for the first time to any public kindergarten or elementary school in a
14	school division unless such pupil shall furnish, prior to admission, (i) a report from a qualified licensed
15	physician, or a licensed nurse practitioner or licensed physician assistant acting under the supervision of
16	a licensed physician, of a comprehensive physical examination of a scope prescribed by the State Health
17	Commissioner performed within the 12 months prior to the date such pupil first enters such public
18	kindergarten or elementary school or (ii) records establishing that such pupil furnished such report upon
19 20	prior admission to another school or school division and providing the information contained in such report.
20 21	If the pupil is a homeless child or youth as defined in § 22.1-3, and for that reason cannot furnish
$\overline{22}$	the report or records required by (i) or (ii) of this subsection, and the person seeking to enroll the pupil
23	furnishes to the school division an affidavit so stating and also indicating that, to the best of his
24	knowledge, such pupil is in good health and free from any communicable or contagious disease, the
25	school division shall immediately refer the student to the local school division liaison, as described in
26	the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Improvements Act of 2001, as amended
27 28	(42 U.S.C. § 11431 et seq.) (the Act), who shall, as soon as practicable, assist in obtaining the necessary
28 29	physical examination by the county or city health department or other clinic or physician's office and shall immediately admit the pupil to school, as required by such Act.
<u>30</u>	B. The physician, or licensed nurse practitioner or licensed physician assistant acting under the
31	supervision of a licensed physician, making a report of a physical examination required by this section
32	shall, at the end of such report, summarize the abnormal physical findings, if any, and shall specifically
33	state what, if any, conditions are found that would identify the child as handicapped.
34	C. Such physical examination report shall be placed in the child's health record at the school and
35	shall be made available for review by any employee or official of the State Department of Health or any
36 37	local health department at the request of such employee or official. D. Such physical examination shall not be required of any child whose parent shall object on
38	religious grounds and who shows no visual evidence of sickness, provided that such parent shall state in
39	writing that, to the best of his knowledge, such child is in good health and free from any communicable
40	or contagious disease.
41	E. The health departments of all of the counties and cities of the Commonwealth shall conduct such
42	physical examinations for medically indigent children without charge upon request and may provide
43	such examinations to others on such uniform basis as such departments may establish.
44 45	F. Parents of entering students shall complete a health information form which shall be distributed by the local school divisions. Such forms shall be developed and provided jointly by the Department of
4 6	Education and Department of Health, or developed and provided by the school division and approved by
47	the Superintendent of Public Instruction. Such forms shall be returnable within 15 days of receipt unless
48	reasonable extensions have been granted by the superintendent or his designee. Upon failure of the
49	parent to complete such form within the extended time, the superintendent may send to the parent
50	written notice of the date he intends to exclude the child from school; however, no child who is a
51 52	homeless child or youth as defined in subdivision A 6 of § 22.1-3 shall be excluded from school for
52 53	such failure to complete such form. G. No physical examination report or health information form shall include a question on the subject
55 54	of the presence of a firearm in the residence of the student.

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
