6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 29.1-735.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to boating safety education
7	requirements.
8	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
9	1. That § 29.1-735.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§ 29.1-735.2. Boating safety education required; Board to promulgate regulations.
11	A. No person shall operate a motorboat with a motor of 10 horsepower or greater or personal
12	watercraft on the public waters of the Commonwealth, unless the operator has met the requirements for
13 14	boating safety education in accordance with the age provisions established in subsection D.
14 15	B. A person shall be considered in compliance with the requirements for boating safety education if
15 16	the person meets one of the following: 1. Completes and passes a boating safety course approved by the National Association of State
17	Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA) and accepted by the Department;
18	2. Passes a proctored an approved in-person or online equivalency examination that tests the
19	knowledge of information included in the curriculum of an approved course;
20	3. Possesses a valid license to operate a vessel issued to maritime personnel by the United States
21	Coast Guard or a marine certificate issued by the Canadian government;
22	4. Possesses a state-approved nonrenewable temporary operator's certificate to operate a motorboat
23	for 90 days that was issued with the certificate of number for the motorboat, if the boat is new or was
24	sold with a transfer of ownership;
25	5. Possesses a rental or lease agreement from a motorboat rental or leasing business, which lists the
26	person as the authorized operator of the motorboat;
27 28	6. Operates the motorboat under onboard direct supervision of a person who meets the requirements of this section;
20 29	7. Demonstrates that he is not a resident, is temporarily using the waters of Virginia for a period not
3 0	to exceed 90 days, and meets any applicable boating safety education requirements of the state of
31	residency, or possesses a Canadian Pleasure Craft Operator's Card;
32	8. Has assumed operation of the motorboat due to the illness or physical impairment of the initial
33	operator, and is returning the motorboat to shore in order to provide assistance or care for the operator;
34	9. Is registered as a commercial fisherman pursuant to § 28.2-241 or a person who is under the
35	onboard direct supervision of the commercial fisherman while operating the commercial fisherman's
36	boat; or
37	10. Provides documentation that he is serving or has qualified as a surface warfare officer or enlisted
38 39	surface warfare specialist in the United States Navy; or
40	11. Possesses a valid Virginia seafood landing license, Virginia oyster aquaculture product owner permit, Virginia oyster aquaculture harvester permit, Virginia clam aquaculture product owner permit,
41	or Virginia clam aquaculture harvester permit.
42	C. The Board shall promulgate regulations by July 1, 2008, to implement a boating safety education
43	program for all motorboat and personal watercraft operators to meet boating safety education
44	requirements.
45	D. Such regulations shall include provisions that phase-in the requirements for boating safety
46	education according to the following:
47	1. Personal watercraft operators 20 years of age or younger to meet the requirements by July 1,
48 49	2009; 2. Personal watercraft operators 35 years of age or younger to meet the requirements by July 1,
50	2. reisonal watererart operators 33 years of age or younger to meet the requirements by sury 1, 2010;
51	3. Personal watercraft operators 50 years of age or younger to meet the requirements by July 1,
52	2011;
53	4. All personal watercraft operators, regardless of age, to meet the requirements by July 1, 2012;
54	5. Motorboat operators 20 years of age or younger to meet the requirements by July 1, 2011;
55	6. Motorboat operators 30 years of age or younger to meet the requirements by July 1, 2012;
56	7. Motorboat operators 40 years of age or younger to meet the requirements by July 1, 2013;
57	8. Motorboat operators 45 years of age or younger to meet the requirements by July 1, 2014;
58 59	9. Motorboat operators 50 years of age or younger to meet the requirements by July 1, 2015; and
39	10. All for all motorboat operators, regardless of age, to meet the requirements by July 1, 2016.

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E. Such regulations may include, but not be limited to, provisions for compliance, statewide 60 availability of NASBLA-approved courses including through the Internet, the issuance of certificates to 61 62 document successful course completion, duplicate certificates, recordkeeping, requirements for course 63 providers, instructor certification, student name and address changes, equivalency exam criteria, provisions for an open-book test for classroom based courses, requirements for motorboat rental and 64 65 leasing businesses, issuance of a temporary operator's certificate, and the establishment of fees (not to 66 exceed the cost of giving such instruction for each person participating in and receiving the instruction) for boating safety courses and certificates. 67

F. The Board shall consult and coordinate with the boating public, professional organizations forrecreational boating safety, and the boating retail, leasing, and dealer business community in thepromulgation of such regulations.

71 G. Any person who operates a motorboat on the waters of the Commonwealth shall, upon the request 72 of a law-enforcement officer, present to the officer evidence that he has complied with subsection B.

H. Any person who violates any provision of this section or any regulation promulgated hereunder
shall be subject to a civil penalty of \$100. All civil penalties assessed under this section shall be
deposited in the Motorboat and Water Safety Fund of the Game Protection Fund and used as provided
for in § 29.1-701.

77 I. The provisions of this section shall not apply to law-enforcement officers while they are engaged 78 in the performance of their official duties.
