15103086D **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 290** 1 2 Offered January 16, 2015 3 Expressing support for the establishment of the Governor's School for Innovation and Entrepreneurship 4 in Hampton Roads. 5 Patrons-Lewis, Alexander, McWaters and Wagner; Delegate: James 6 7 Referred to Committee on Rules 8 9 WHEREAS, since the end of World War II, nearly one-half of all economic growth in the United 10 States has resulted from innovation in scientific and technological fields, and market analysts predict that the fastest-growing occupations in the country will require a background in science, technology, 11 12 engineering, or mathematics; and WHEREAS, high school students in the United States regularly perform below international averages 13 14 in mathematics and sciences, and only 15 percent of college graduates in the United States earn degrees 15 in natural sciences or engineering; and 16 WHEREAS, in an effort to secure the nation's competitive edge in high-tech fields and provide Virginians with the tools and knowledge to spur economic growth through innovation, Norfolk Public 17 Schools and Portsmouth Public Schools initiated a study on the feasibility of opening a Governor's 18 School specializing in engineering and entrepreneurship; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the Governor's School for Innovation and Entrepreneurship would be a full-day, 21 academic year school, similar to Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology in 22 Annandale, which has enabled students throughout the region to achieve higher levels of proficiency in science, technology, engineering, and math; and 23 24 WHEREAS, while similar in approach to Thomas Jefferson High School, the Governor's School for 25 Innovation and Entrepreneurship would be distinguished by its mission to teach students how to innovate through engineering and to build companies around breakthroughs for new products and services; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the Governor's School for Innovation and Entrepreneurship could significantly enhance 28 the Tidewater region, equipping a new generation of entrepreneurs to create better job opportunities for 29 Virginians by starting new companies that serve the Commonwealth and the United States through the 30 development of innovative, high-tech products; and 31 WHEREAS, the Economic Development Authorities of Norfolk, Chesapeake, and Virginia Beach and the City Council of Suffolk have adopted resolutions endorsing the establishment of the Governor's 32 33 School for Innovation and Entrepreneurship; and WHEREAS, the Hampton Roads Community Foundation's Workforce Development Study Group, 34 35 chaired by President Matthew Mulherin of Newport News Shipbuilding and President John Dever of 36 Thomas Nelson Community College, have endorsed the Governor's School for Innovation and 37 Entrepreneurship as a critical regional priority; and WHEREAS, the feasibility study conducted by Dr. David Sawyer, a former superintendent of school 38 39 divisions in multiples states and the former Fairfax County assistant superintendent who had responsibility for converting Thomas Jefferson High School into a Governor's School almost 30 years 40 41 ago, concluded that the proposed Governor's School for Innovation and Entrepreneurship is feasible and enjoys sufficient support among the gifted student population and regional educational, business, civic, 42 and political leaders to be successful; the study recommends the development of a plan to establish the 43 Governor's School for Innovation and Entrepreneurship; and 44 WHEREAS, in 2014, the Greater Norfolk Corporation and a coalition of dozens of businesses and 45 organizations in Chesapeake, Portsmouth, Virginia Beach, and Norfolk endorsed the establishment of a 46 Governor's School for Innovation and Entrepreneurship; now, therefore, be it 47 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly express 48 49 support for the establishment of the Governor's School for Innovation and Entrepreneurship in Hampton 50 Roads: and, be it 51 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit copies of this resolution to 52 Chesapeake Public Schools, Norfolk Public Schools, Portsmouth Public Schools, Suffolk Public Schools, 53 and Virginia Beach City Public Schools, requesting that the organizations further disseminate copies of this resolution to their respective constituents so that they may be apprised of the sense of the General 54 Assembly of Virginia in this matter. 55

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
