4	Establishing a joint committee of the Senate Committee on Education and Health and the House
5	Committee on Education to study options for changing the number, frequency, or content of
6	Standards of Learning assessments. Report.

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11	WHEREAS, elementary and secondary school students in the Commonwealth are required to take 34
12	criterion-referenced assessments associated with the Standards of Learning (SOL) in grades three through
13	11; and
14	WHEREAS, school accountability is an important goal of the public school system in the
15	Commonwealth, but it must be balanced with meaningful, individualized student learning and student
16 17	growth; and WHEREAS avagasive testing and test propagation may inhibit the shility of teachers to sultivate on
18	WHEREAS, excessive testing and test preparation may inhibit the ability of teachers to cultivate an environment in which students are encouraged to think critically and develop a deep and nuanced
19	understanding of the SOL subjects and course content; and
20	WHEREAS, the prosperity of the Commonwealth is linked to the ability of its public schools to train
21	college and career ready high school graduates with critical thinking skills; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That a joint committee of the Senate
23	Committee on Education and Health and the House Committee on Education be established to study
24	options for changing the number, frequency, or content of Standards of Learning assessments. The joint
25 26	committee shall have a total membership of 13 members. Two members of the Senate Committee on Education and Health shall be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules upon the recommendation
20 27	of the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Education and Health and four members of the House
28	Committee on Education to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates upon the
29	recommendation of the Chairman of the House Committee on Education. The Secretary of Education,
30	the Superintendent of Public Instruction, and one member from each of the following organizations shall
31	serve ex officio with voting privileges and without compensation: the Virginia School Board
32 33	Association, The Virginia Association of School Superintendents, the Virginia Association of Secondary School Principals, the Virginia Association of Elementary School Principals, and the Virginia Education
33 34	Association. Each respective entity and association shall reimburse each ex officio member for his travel
35	expenses. The joint committee shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership.
36	In conducting its study, the joint committee shall gather information and develop recommendations
37	on:
38	1. The feasibility of changing the number, frequency, or content of SOL assessments administered to
<b>39</b>	public school students in grades three through 11;
40 41	<ol> <li>Which SOL assessments to eliminate and which SOL assessments to continue administering;</li> <li>When to administer SOL assessments;</li> </ol>
42	4. Whether to administer SOL assessments with essay and short answer questions rather than
43	multiple choice questions;
44	5. Whether to allow students to forego SOL assessments if they achieve satisfactory scores on
45	Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, or other such examinations; and
46	6. The appropriateness of alternative assessments for students with disabilities and student with
47 48	limited English proficiency. In conducting its study, the joint committee shall consider the number, frequency, and content of
49	benchmark assessments and other assessments that students are required to take in addition to SOL
50	assessments.
51	Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the Senate. Legal,
52	research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint committee shall be provided by the
53	Division of Legislative Services. Technical assistance shall be provided by the Department of Education,
54 55	the Secretary of Education, and the local school boards. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall
55 56	provide assistance to the joint committee for this study, upon request. The joint committee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2014 interim. An estimated \$11,280 is
50 57	The joint committee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2014 interim. An estimated \$11,280 is allocated for speakers, materials, and other resources. Approval for unbudgeted nonmember-related
58	expenses shall require the written authorization of the chairman of the joint committee and the respective

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59 Clerk. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both 60 Clerks shall be required.

No recommendation of the joint committee shall be adopted if a majority of the Senate members or a majority of the House members of the joint committee (i) vote against the recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the joint committee.

64 The joint committee shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2014, and the chairman shall 65 submit an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2015 Regular Session of the General Assembly to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems. The 66 executive summary shall state whether the joint committee intends to submit to the General Assembly 67 and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate **68** document. The executive summary and the report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of 69 70 the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports 71 and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
 Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or
 delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the 2014 interim.
