4. Title: Certifying emergency medical services providers

5. Summary: This bill provides that regulations of the Board of Health governing qualifications for certification of emergency medical services providers shall require no more than 40 hours of classroom instruction for certification of an emergency medical services provider as an emergency medical responder or emergency medical services first responder and no more than 80 hours of classroom instruction for certification of an emergency medical services provider as an emergency medical technician.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill would not have a fiscal impact on the Commonwealth. The bill adds regulations governing qualifications for certification of emergency medical service providers. The Board of Health will have to amend existing regulations. However, no budget amendment is needed.
