**4. Title:** A-F school grading system; repeals system.

**5. Summary:** The proposed legislation would repeal the A-F school grading system created in the 2013 Session. In the 2014 Session the implementation of the system was delayed. The Board of Education is currently in the process of finalizing the school performance letter grading system for use by October 1, 2016, as required by the 2014 Session legislation.
