3. Committee: Education and Health

4. Title: Standards of Learning tests; expedited retake.

5. Summary: The proposed legislation would require the Board of Education to promulgate regulations to provide the same criteria for eligibility for an expedited retake of any Standards of Learning (SOL) test, with the exception of the writing SOL assessment, to all students regardless of grade level or course. Currently, expedited retake is only available for assessments that are required for high school graduation.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: None.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: The bill would allow students who failed a SOL assessment within a specified range the opportunity to retake the test within the same testing window. The Governor's introduced budget includes \$200,000 of general fund support in FY 2016 to cover the state costs related to expedited retakes for the reading, mathematics, science and history assessments. Both the House and Senate proposed budgets include this funding.

School divisions would be required to provide the space and staffing necessary for such retakes.
