5. Summary:

Under current law, it is a Class 1 misdemeanor to publicly engage in actual or explicitly simulated acts of masturbation. The proposed legislation would make a third conviction of the offense a Class 6 felony.

- **6. Budget Amendment Necessary**: Yes. Item 385. The House did not include funding for the fiscal impact of this legislation in its amendments to the budget bill.

8. Fiscal Implications:

For someone convicted of a Class 6 felony, a judge has the option of sentencing him or her to up to one year in jail, or 1 to 5 years in prison. Pursuant to §30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission estimates a fiscal impact of \$207,232 (the highest annual cost over the next six years). The amount is based on the projection that the legislation will result in seven additional inmates being incarcerated in prison.
