4. Title: Concealed handgun permit; revocation of permit if delinquent in child support payments

5. Summary: The proposed legislation provides for the revocation of an individual's concealed handgun permit if such individual (i) has failed to comply with a subpoena, summons, or warrant relating to paternity or child support proceedings or (ii) is delinquent in the payment of child support by 90 days or more or in an amount of \$5,000 or more. If the obligor remedies the delinquency, reaches an agreement with the obligee or Department of Social Services to remedy the delinquency, or complies with the subpoena, summons, or warrant, he may reapply for a concealed weapons permit.

7. Minimal Fiscal Impact (See Item 8)

8. Fiscal Implications: The proposed legislation is expected to have some effect on child support collections; however a specific impact cannot be determined. The bill's provisions are not expected to warrant the need for additional staff or resources at the Department of Social Services. The bill would also require courts to revoke additional concealed handgun permits and possibly result in additional hearings in circuit courts. The Office of the Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court estimates that any associated fiscal impact can be accommodated utilizing existing resources. Virginia State Police reports that the bill should not have a fiscal impact for the department.
