3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Government Data Collection and Dissemination Practices Act; limitations on use of information.

5. Summary: The proposal limits the ability of law-enforcement and regulatory agencies to use technology to collect and maintain personal information on individuals and organizations where a warrant has not been issued and there is no reasonable suspicion of criminal activity by the individual or organization.

The bill also allows a law-enforcement agency to collect information from a license plate reader, provided that any information collected shall only be retained for seven days and only be used for the investigation of a crime or a report of a missing person. After seven days, the information is to be purged unless it is being utilized in an ongoing investigation. The bill describes the meaning of the term "license plate reader".

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: The legislation would require a criminal or administrative warrant before law enforcement or regulatory agencies can use technology to collect or maintain personal information in a passive manner when the data collected is not intended for prompt evaluation and potential use for suspected criminal activity or terrorism by an individual or organization. However, law enforcement agencies can collect information from license plate readers and the information can be retained only for seven days unless it is being utilized in an ongoing investigation. The legislation has no known fiscal impact on state agencies.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Department of State Police, and local law enforcement agencies.
