3. Committee: Health, Welfare and Institutions

4. Title: Delivery of prescription drug orders for PACE programs.

5. Summary: Provides that prescription drug orders dispensed to a patient and delivered to a program of all-inclusive care for the elderly (PACE) facility licensed by the Department of Medical Assistance Services may be stored, retained, and repackaged at the facility on behalf of a patient for subsequent delivery or administration. The bill requires that repackaging of dispensed prescription drugs retained by the PACE facility be performed by a pharmacist, pharmacy technician, nurse, or other person who has successfully completed a Board-approved training program for such purpose. The bill directs the Board of Pharmacy to promulgate regulations related to training, packaging, labeling, and recordkeeping for such repackaging.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill would not have a fiscal impact on the Commonwealth. The Department of Health Professions has stated that this would not impact operations as they can mirror regulations currently in place for re-packaging in community service boards.
