4. Title: Employment in private security and related industries

5. Summary:

The proposed legislation would prohibit any person required to register as a sex offender from being employed as a registered or certified employee by a private security services business or training school or from being issued any of the following by the Department of Criminal Justice Services:

- Private security services registration;
- Unarmed security officer certification;
- Electronic security employee or technician's assistant certification;
- Private security services training school or instructor certification;
- Compliance agent certification; or
- Private security services business license.

The Director of the Department would be authorized to waive any prohibition, upon written request.

8. Fiscal Implications:

The proposed legislation could result in the loss of fee revenue by the Department of Criminal Justice Services, but there is insufficient information available to project the potential extent of such loss.
