5.	<b>Summary:</b> Requires a physician or other person who renders any medical aid or treatment to any person for an overdose that he knows or has reason to believe is an overdose of a controlled substance classified in Schedule I or II of the Drug Control Act to report such aid or treatment and the patient's name and address, if known, to local law enforcement.

8.	<b>Fiscal Implications:</b> The agency has stated that this bill will not impact agency operations. Furthermore, noncompliance is a Class 3 misdemeanor, which does not carry any jail or prison time and is handled via a fine. There is no way of projecting the number of persons likely to be convicted nor the amount of any fine imposed, therefore the fiscal impact would be indeterminate.
