8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of Conservation and Recreation, there is no state expenditure impact as a result of this bill. When revisions to a plan are needed for business reasons and customer needs, updates will be done. However, this legislation eliminates the department's requirement to officially review a plan at the five year interval when adjustments are not needed. Given this, there could be some savings, but the amount cannot be determined.
