3. Committee: Senate Finance

4. Title: Compensation of court-appointed counsel; waivers.

5. Summary: Allows court-appointed counsel for parents in child welfare cases to submit a waiver application for additional compensation of \$120 in district court and \$158 for cases appealed to the circuit court.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: Yes, Items 39 and 41

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary (see Item #8)

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Office of the Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court (OES) most of the parents in the cases impacted by this bill are indigent and require court appointed counsel.

The juvenile and domestic relations district court (J&DR) cases impacted by this legislation involve issues such as abuse and neglect, custody relief, entrustment, foster care review, permanency and child at risk. According to the Office of the Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court, the total fiscal impact of this bill on juvenile and domestic relations district courts is estimated to be \$3.1 million. The following table shows the cost breakdown between case types based on a 4 year average of the number of cases heard in juvenile and domestic relations district courts around the Commonwealth:
