**4. Title:** Resource management plans; consideration of certain records in closed meetings.

**5. Summary:** Adds to the list of purposes for which public bodies may hold closed meetings, the purpose of discussing certain records that contain information collected pursuant to the creation of a resource management plan. The bill permits only specified review committees or boards to close their meetings, or portions of their meetings, when discussing the records. The bill does not remove the general bar against closed meetings when the records have been transformed into an aggregate form or when the person who is the subject of the regulations has consented to their release.
