**4. Title:** Obtaining records concerning electronic communication service; authentication of contents.

**5. Summary:** Provides that providers of electronic communication services can provide real-time location data to an investigative or law-enforcement officer without a warrant so long as the disclosure is not prohibited by federal law and at least one of the following circumstances applies: (i) an officer is responding to a user's call for emergency services, (ii) an officer has the informed, affirmative consent of the owner or user of the electronic device concerned, (iii) an officer has the informed, affirmative consent of the legal guardian or next of kin of the owner or user if the owner is believed to be deceased, missing, or unable to be contacted, or (iv) an officer believes there to be an emergency involving the immediate danger to a person.
