**4. Title:** Coal mine safety; mine rescue teams.

**5. Summary:** This bill provides that mine-wide tracking systems, firefighting, and fire sensor equipment be maintained and in usable and operative conditions and that electric equipment be maintained in safe operating condition at all times while it is being used, and any unsafe condition shall be corrected promptly or the equipment shall be removed from service. The bill also provides that mine foremen are responsible for compliance with health and safety requirements and are responsible for ensuring that every miner is aware of all hazardous conditions prior to working at the mine.
