**4. Title:** Financial exploitation of adults; report to State Police when loss is greater than \$500,000

**5. Summary:** The amended legislation provides that upon receipt of a report, or during an adult protective services investigation, of suspected financial exploitation of an adult in which financial losses to the adult resulting from the exploitation are suspected to be greater than \$100,000, the local department of social services or adult protective services hotline shall immediately refer the matter and all relevant documentation to both the State Police and the local law-enforcement agency where the adult resides or where the alleged exploitation took place or, if these places are unknown, where the alleged exploitation was discovered, for investigation.

Fiscal Implications:** The Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services indicates that, while the bill would add some additional responsibilities to adult protective services workers and hotline staff, these added requirements would be similar to existing duties and should therefore not be difficult to incorporate into current procedures.
