**4. Title:** Juvenile law-enforcement records; restorative justice.

**5. Summary:** The substitute bill provides that local law enforcement agencies may release information regarding juvenile arrests for the purpose of referring a juvenile to a restorative justice program. However, such information may be prohibited from release to protect a criminal investigation or intelligence information. The bill also requires that restorative justice programs shall not (i) disclose any juvenile record information obtained pursuant to this subsection or (ii) use such information for any purpose other than for the facilitation of a restorative justice program.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The legislation has no material impact on state agencies, including Virginia Department of Juvenile Justice and Virginia State Police.
