4. Title: Community Integration Advisory Commission; membership

5. Summary: Expands nonlegislative citizen membership eligibility to include one individual who is receiving or has received services in a state hospital operated by the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, one individual who is receiving or has received services in a state or private intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disability, and one current or former resident of a nursing facility. Under current law, membership includes one individual who is currently receiving services in a state hospital operated by the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, one individual who is currently receiving services in a state training center, and one current resident of a nursing facility. The bill also extends the sunset for this article until July 1, 2019.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final.

8. Fiscal Implications: This adds new members to the commission. The existing statute directs that members of the commission be reimbursed for reasonable travel expenses to attend meetings, but that the funds to pay those costs come from within executive branch agency budgets as designated by the Governor. This bill also extends the life of the commission an additional three years.
