**4. Title:** Supervised clinical training fulfills requirement for licensure

**5. Summary:** Provides that supervised clinical training that is received in the United States as part of the curriculum of an international medical school may fulfill the requirements for licensure by the Board of Medicine if the clinical training is in a program acceptable to the Board and deemed a substantially equivalent experience. Current law requires such clinical training to be received in a hospital, institution, or school that offers an approved residency program in the specialty area for the relevant clinical training.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill has no fiscal impact on the Commonwealth. The bill expands the requirement for licensure to include supervised clinical training received in the United States that is part of an international medical school curriculum.
