**2. Patron:** Marsden

**3. Committee:** Senate Committee for Courts of Justice

**4. Title:** Department of Juvenile Justice; juveniles on probation; funding for re-entry and release services.

**5. Summary:** Allows funding currently being used for re-entry and release services, including residential placement or treatment services, for juveniles on parole supervision to also be used for persons on probation supervision after placement in a detention home that exceeds 30 calendar days. The bill additionally changes all references of "child" to "person" to allow funds to be used for persons who are 18, 19, or 20 years old at the time of release from commitment to the Department.
