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HOUSE BILL NO. 1313

A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 18.2-308.07 and 18.2-308.1:4 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 18.2-308.01:1, relating to carrying concealed handguns; protective orders; surrender of firearms; penalty.

10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 18.2-308.07 and 18.2-308.1:4 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and 11 12 that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 18.2-308.01:1 as follows: § 18.2-308.01:1. Carrying a concealed handgun with a valid protective order. 13

14 A. The prohibition against carrying a concealed handgun in clause (i) of subsection A of § 18.2-308 15 shall not apply to any person 21 years of age or older who is not prohibited from purchasing, possessing, or transporting a firearm under state or federal law and is protected by (i) a protective 16 order issued pursuant to § 16.1-253.1, 16.1-253.4, 16.1-279.1, 19.2-152.8, 19.2-152.9, or 19.2-152.10; 17 (ii) an order issued pursuant to subsection B of § 20-103; or (iii) an order issued pursuant to subsection 18 E of § 18.2-60.3 for 45 days after such order was issued or until such order expires or is otherwise 19 20 dissolved by the issuing court, whichever occurs first, provided the order includes clause (i) of subsection B of § 18.2-308.1:4 as a condition of such order. 21

22 B. If during the period set forth in subsection A the person issued the protective order applies for a 23 concealed handgun permit, the prohibition against carrying a concealed handgun in clause (i) of 24 subsection A of § 18.2-308 shall not apply to such person for an additional 45 days from the date of 25 the application. The clerk shall certify on the application that the period has been extended for an additional 45 days from the date of the application and shall indicate the date on which the period 26 27 expires. A copy of the certified application shall be given to such person and shall serve as a de facto 28 permit. The clerk shall expedite the processing of any application for a concealed handgun permit 29 submitted by a person in accordance with this subsection.

30 C. The person issued the protective order shall have such order on his person at all times during 31 which he is carrying a concealed handgun, except if such person has been given a copy of a certified application pursuant to subsection B, then such person shall have such certified application on his 32 33 person at all times during which he is carrying a concealed handgun. Such person shall display the 34 order or certified application and a photo identification issued by a government agency of the 35 Commonwealth or by the U.S. Department of Defense or U.S. State Department (passport) upon demand 36 by a law-enforcement officer.

37 D. Failure to display the order or certified application and a photo identification upon demand by a 38 law-enforcement officer is punishable by a \$25 civil penalty, which shall be paid into the state treasury. 39 Any attorney for the Commonwealth of the county or city in which the alleged violation occurred may 40 bring an action to recover the civil penalty. A court may waive such penalty upon presentation to the 41 court of a valid order or certified application and government-issued photo identification. Any law-enforcement officer may issue a summons for the civil violation of failure to display the order or 42 43 certified application and photo identification upon demand.

É. Nothing in this section authorizes the possession of any weapon on property or in places where 44 such possession is otherwise prohibited by law or is prohibited by the owner of private property. 45 46

§ 18.2-308.07. Entry of information into the Virginia Criminal Information Network.

47 A. An order issuing a concealed handgun permit pursuant to § 18.2-308.04, or the copy of the permit application certified by the clerk as a de facto permit pursuant to § 18.2-308.01:1 or 18.2-308.05, 48 49 shall be provided to the State Police and the law-enforcement agencies of the county or city by the clerk of the court. The State Police shall enter the permittee's name and description in the Virginia Criminal 50 51 Information Network so that the permit's existence and current status will be made known to 52 law-enforcement personnel accessing the Network for investigative purposes.

53 B. The Department of State Police shall enter the name and description of a person issued a 54 nonresident permit pursuant to § 18.2-308.06 in the Virginia Criminal Information Network so that the 55 permit's existence and current status are known to law-enforcement personnel accessing the Network for investigative purposes. 56

57 C. The State Police shall withhold from public disclosure permittee information submitted to the 58 State Police for purposes of entry into the Virginia Criminal Information Network, except that such

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59 information shall not be withheld from any law-enforcement agency, officer, or authorized agent thereof 60 acting in the performance of official law-enforcement duties, nor shall such information be withheld from an entity that has a valid contract with any local, state, or federal law-enforcement agency for the 61 62 purpose of performing official duties of the law-enforcement agency. However, nothing in this 63 subsection shall be construed to prohibit the release of (i) records by the State Police concerning permits issued to nonresidents of the Commonwealth pursuant to § 18.2-308.06 or (ii) statistical summaries, 64 65 abstracts, or other records containing information in an aggregate form that does not identify any 66 individual permittees.

67 § 18.2-308.1:4. Purchase or transportation of firearm by persons subject to protective orders; 68 penalty.

A. It is unlawful for any person who is subject to (i) a protective order entered pursuant to 16.1-253.1, 16.1-253.4, 16.1-278.2, 16.1-279.1, 19.2-152.8, 19.2-152.9, or 19.2-152.10; (ii) an order issued pursuant to subsection B of § 20-103; (iii) an order entered pursuant to subsection E of 69 70 71 § 18.2-60.3; (iv) a preliminary protective order entered pursuant to subsection F of § 16.1-253 where a 72 petition alleging abuse or neglect has been filed; or (v) an order issued by a tribunal of another state, 73 74 the United States or any of its territories, possessions or commonwealths, or the District of Columbia 75 pursuant to a statute that is substantially similar to those cited in clauses (i), (ii), (iii), or (iv) to purchase 76 or transport any firearm while the order is in effect, except that a person may transport a firearm solely 77 for the purpose of surrendering such firearm in accordance with subsection C. Any person with a 78 concealed handgun permit shall be prohibited from carrying any concealed firearm, and shall surrender 79 his permit to the court entering the order, for the duration of any protective order referred to herein.

B. At the time a court or magistrate enters any protective order referred to in subsection A, the
person protected by the protective order may request either (i) that the protective order authorize such
person to carry a concealed handgun in accordance with § 18.2-308.01:1 or (ii) that the person who is
subject to the protective order surrender any firearm in his possession in accordance with subsection C.
Any request made by the person protected by the protective order shall be included by the court or
magistrate as one of the conditions imposed by the protective order.

86 C. Within 24 hours of being served with a protective order that includes clause (ii) of subsection B 87 as a condition of such order, a person shall surrender any firearm possessed by him to the 88 law-enforcement agency for the locality in which such person resides for the duration of such order. The 89 law-enforcement agency shall prepare a written receipt containing the name of the person surrendering 90 the firearm, the date on which the firearm was surrendered, and the manufacturer, model, and serial 91 number of the firearm. The person surrendering the firearm shall sign the receipt, and the 92 law-enforcement agency shall provide him with a copy of the receipt. Upon the expiration of the 93 protective order and presentation of a copy of the receipt by the person to the law-enforcement agency. 94 the law-enforcement agency shall return the firearm.

95 *D*. A violation of this section is a Class 1 misdemeanor.

96 2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or 97 commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation is \$0 98 for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities and \$0 for periods of commitment 99 to the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice.
