9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 20-124.4 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11	§ 20-124.4. Mediation.
12	A. In any appropriate case the court shall refer the parents or persons with a legitimate interest to a
13	dispute resolution evaluation orientation session to be conducted by a mediator certified pursuant to
13 14	guidelines promulgated by the Judicial Council at no cost and in accordance with the procedures set out
14	in Chapter 20.2 (§ 8.01-576.4 et seq.) of Title 8.01. In assessing the appropriateness of a referral, the
16	court shall ascertain upon motion of a party whether there is a history of family abuse. If an agreement
17	is not reached on any issue through further mediation as agreed to by the parties, prior to the return date
18	set by the court pursuant to § 8.01-576.5, the court shall proceed with a hearing on any unresolved
19	issue, unless a continuance has been granted by the court. The fee of a mediator appointed in any
20	custody, support or visitation case shall be \$100 per appointment and shall be paid by the
21	Commonwealth from the funds appropriated for payment of appointments made pursuant to subsection B
	of <u>§ 16.1-267.</u>
23	B. The fee of the mediator shall be \$120 per appointment mediated and shall be paid by the
