16104468D **HOUSE BILL NO. 330** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the House Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions 4 on January 19, 2016) 5 6 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Pogge) A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 54.1-3000, 54.1-3005, and 54.1-3013 of the Code of Virginia and to 7 amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Article 2 of Chapter 30 of Title 54.1 a section numbered 8 54.1-3018.1, relating to registration of clinical nurse specialists. 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That §§ 54.1-3000, 54.1-3005, and 54.1-3013 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted 10 11 and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Article 2 of Chapter 30 of Title 54.1 a section numbered 54.1-3018.1 as follows: 12 § 54.1-3000. Definitions. 13 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning: 14 15 "Board" means the Board of Nursing. "Certified nurse aide" means a person who meets the qualifications specified in this article and who 16 17 is currently certified by the Board. "Clinical nurse specialist" means a personan advanced practice registered nurse who meets the 18 requirements set forth in §54.1-3018.1 and who is currently registered by the Board in addition to 19 20 holding a license under the provisions of this chapter to practice professional nursing as defined in this 21 section. Such a person shall be recognized as being able to provide advanced services according to the 22 specialized training received from a program approved by satisfactory to the Board, but shall not be entitled to perform any act that is not within the scope of practice of professional nursing. 23 "Certified massage therapist" means a person who meets the qualifications specified in this chapter 24 25 and who is currently certified by the Board. "Massage therapy" means the treatment of soft tissues for therapeutic purposes by the application of 26 27 massage and bodywork techniques based on the manipulation or application of pressure to the muscular 28 structure or soft tissues of the human body. The terms "massage therapy" and "therapeutic massage" do 29 not include the diagnosis or treatment of illness or disease or any service or procedure for which a 30 license to practice medicine, nursing, chiropractic therapy, physical therapy, occupational therapy, acupuncture, or podiatry is required by law. 31 "Nurse practitioner" means an advanced practice registered nurse who is jointly licensed by the Boards of Medicine and Nursing pursuant to § 54.1-2957. 32 33 34 "Practical nurse" or "licensed practical nurse" means a person who is licensed or holds a multistate 35 licensure privilege under the provisions of this chapter to practice practical nursing as defined in this section. Such a licensee shall be empowered to provide nursing services without compensation. The 36 37 abbreviation "L.P.N." shall stand for such terms. 38 "Practical nursing" or "licensed practical nursing" means the performance for compensation of 39 selected nursing acts in the care of individuals or groups who are ill, injured, or experiencing changes in 40 normal health processes; in the maintenance of health; in the prevention of illness or disease; or, subject 41 to such regulations as the Board may promulgate, in the teaching of those who are or will be nurse 42 aides. Practical nursing or licensed practical nursing requires knowledge, judgment and skill in nursing procedures gained through prescribed education. Practical nursing or licensed practical nursing is 43 performed under the direction or supervision of a licensed medical practitioner, a professional nurse, 44 registered nurse or registered professional nurse or other licensed health professional authorized by regulations of the Board. 46 "Practice of a nurse aide" or "nurse aide practice" means the performance of services requiring the 47 education, training, and skills specified in this chapter for certification as a nurse aide. Such services are **48** 49 performed under the supervision of a dentist, physician, podiatrist, professional nurse, licensed practical nurse, or other licensed health care professional acting within the scope of the requirements of his profession. "Professional nurse," "registered nurse" or "registered professional nurse" means a person who is 52 53 licensed or holds a multistate licensure privilege under the provisions of this chapter to practice 54 professional nursing as defined in this section. Such a licensee shall be empowered to provide professional services without compensation, to promote health and to teach health to individuals and 55 groups. The abbreviation "R.N." shall stand for such terms. 56 "Professional nursing," "registered nursing" or "registered professional nursing" means the performance for compensation of any nursing acts in the observation, care and counsel of individuals or 57 58

groups who are ill, injured or experiencing changes in normal health processes or the maintenance of

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60 health; in the prevention of illness or disease; in the supervision and teaching of those who are or will

be involved in nursing care; in the delegation of selected nursing tasks and procedures to appropriately 61 trained unlicensed persons as determined by the Board; or in the administration of medications and 62

63 treatments as prescribed by any person authorized by law to prescribe such medications and treatment.

64 Professional nursing, registered nursing and registered professional nursing require specialized education,

65 judgment, and skill based upon knowledge and application of principles from the biological, physical, 66 social, behavioral and nursing sciences.

§ 54.1-3005. Specific powers and duties of Board.

In addition to the general powers and duties conferred in this title, the Board shall have the 68 69 following specific powers and duties:

70 1. To prescribe minimum standards and approve curricula for educational programs preparing persons 71 for licensure or certification under this chapter; 72

2. To approve programs that meet the requirements of this chapter and of the Board; 73

3. To provide consultation service for educational programs as requested;

74 4. To provide for periodic surveys of educational programs;

75 5. To deny or withdraw approval from educational programs for failure to meet prescribed standards;

76 6. To provide consultation regarding nursing practice for institutions and agencies as requested and 77 investigate illegal nursing practices; 78

7. To keep a record of all its proceedings;

8. To certify and maintain a registry of all certified nurse aides and to promulgate regulations 79 consistent with federal law and regulation. The Board shall require all schools to demonstrate their 80 compliance with § 54.1-3006.2 upon application for approval or reapproval, during an on-site visit, or in 81 response to a complaint or a report of noncompliance. The Board may impose a fee pursuant to 82 § 54.1-2401 for any violation thereof. Such regulations may include standards for the authority of 83 84 licensed practical nurses to teach nurse aides;

85 9. To approve programs that entitle professional nurses to be registered as clinical nurse specialists 86 and to prescribe minimum standards for such programs;

87 10. To maintain a registry of clinical nurse specialists and to promulgate regulations governing 88 clinical nurse specialists;

89 11. 10. To certify and maintain a registry of all certified massage therapists and to promulgate 90 regulations governing the criteria for certification as a massage therapist and the standards of 91 professional conduct for certified massage therapists;

92 12. 11. To promulgate regulations for the delegation of certain nursing tasks and procedures not 93 involving assessment, evaluation or nursing judgment to an appropriately trained unlicensed person by 94 and under the supervision of a registered nurse, who retains responsibility and accountability for such 95 delegation:

96 13. 12. To develop and revise as may be necessary, in coordination with the Boards of Medicine and Education, guidelines for the training of employees of a school board in the administration of insulin 97 98 and glucagon for the purpose of assisting with routine insulin injections and providing emergency treatment for life-threatening hypoglycemia. The first set of such guidelines shall be finalized by 99 100 September 1, 1999, and shall be made available to local school boards for a fee not to exceed the costs 101 of publication;

102 14. 13. To enter into the Nurse Licensure Compact as set forth in this chapter and to promulgate 103 regulations for its implementation;

104 15. 14. To collect, store and make available nursing workforce information regarding the various 105 categories of nurses certified, licensed or registered pursuant to § 54.1-3012.1;

16. 15. To expedite application processing, to the extent possible, for an applicant for licensure or 106 certification by the Board upon submission of evidence that the applicant, who is licensed or certified in 107 108 another state, is relocating to the Commonwealth pursuant to a spouse's official military orders;

109 17. 16. To register medication aides and promulgate regulations governing the criteria for such registration and standards of conduct for medication aides; 110

18. 17. To approve training programs for medication aides to include requirements for instructional 111 112 personnel, curriculum, continuing education, and a competency evaluation;

19. 18. To set guidelines for the collection of data by all approved nursing education programs and 113 114 to compile this data in an annual report. The data shall include but not be limited to enrollment, graduation rate, attrition rate, and number of qualified applicants who are denied admission; 115

20. 19. To develop, in consultation with the Board of Pharmacy, guidelines for the training of 116 employees of child day programs as defined in § 63.2-100 and regulated by the State Board of Social 117 Services in the administration of prescription drugs as defined in the Drug Control Act (§ 54.1-3400 et 118 119 seq.). Such training programs shall be taught by a registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, doctor of 120 medicine or osteopathic medicine, or pharmacist;

21. 20. In order to protect the privacy and security of health professionals licensed, registered or 121

122 certified under this chapter, to promulgate regulations permitting use on identification badges of first
123 name and first letter only of last name and appropriate title when practicing in hospital emergency
124 departments, in psychiatric and mental health units and programs, or in health care facility units offering
125 treatment for patients in custody of state or local law-enforcement agencies;

126 22. 21. To revise, as may be necessary, guidelines for seizure management, in coordination with the
 127 Board of Medicine, including the list of rescue medications for students with epilepsy and other seizure
 128 disorders in the public schools. The revised guidelines shall be finalized and made available to the
 129 Board of Education by August 1, 2010. The guidelines shall then be posted on the Department of
 130 Education's website; and

131 23. 22. To promulgate, together with the Board of Medicine, regulations governing the licensure of
 132 nurse practitioners pursuant to § 54.1-2957.

133 § 54.1-3013. Approval of nursing education program.

An institution desiring to conduct a nursing education program to prepare professional or practical nurses or elinical nurse specialists shall apply to the Board and submit evidence that:

136 1. It is prepared to meet the minimum standards prescribed by the Board for either a professional
 137 nursing curriculum, a clinical nurse specialist curriculum or a practical nursing curriculum; and

138 2. It is prepared to meet such other standards as may be established by law or by the Board.

139 A survey of the institution and its entire nursing education program shall be made by the 140 administrative officer or other authorized employee of the Board, who shall submit a written report of 141 the survey to the Board. If, in the opinion of the Board, the requirements necessary for approval are 142 met, it shall be approved as a nursing education program for professional or practical nurses or elinical 143 nurse specialists.

144 New nursing education programs shall not be established or conducted unless approved by the Board.
 145 § 54.1-3018.1. Registration of clinical nurse specialists.

146 The Board may register an applicant as a clinical nurse specialist if the applicant:

147 1. Holds a valid license to practice professional nursing pursuant to this article; and

148 2. Has successfully completed a graduate-level clinical nurse specialist program within a regionally

149 accredited college or university that meets all educational qualifications and standards established by

national certification guidelines and holds a national clinical nurse specialist certification that prepares
 the professional nurse to deliver advanced nursing services.

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
