- 2 3 4 5 6 A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 22.1-199.6, relating to the 7 establishment of the Mixed-Delivery Preschool Fund and Grant Program. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
 - 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-199.6 as follows:
- § 22.1-199.6. Mixed-Delivery Preschool Fund and Grant Program established. 10

A. As used in this section, "mixed-delivery" includes public, nonsectarian private, and faith-based 11 12 early education programs.

13 B. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the 14 Mixed-Delivery Preschool Fund, referred to in this section as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established 15 on the books of the Comptroller. Any gifts, donations, grants, bequests, or other funds received on its behalf shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the 16 17 Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in 18 the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purposes of awarding grants to successful 19 20 applicants under the Mixed-Delivery Preschool Grant Program. Expenditures and disbursements from 21 the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction. 22

C. The Mixed-Delivery Preschool Grant Program is hereby established for the purpose of awarding 23 24 grants on a competitive basis to urban, suburban, and rural community applicants to field-test 25 innovative strategies and evidence-based practices that support a robust system of mixed-delivery 26 preschool services in the Commonwealth.

27 D. The Virginia Early Childhood Foundation shall administer a request for proposal process to 28 invite community applicants to respond with localized innovations and approaches to a system of 29 mixed-delivery preschool services.

30 E. Grants shall be awarded by the Virginia Early Childhood Foundation, in consultation with the 31 Department of Education, and the Foundation shall notify the Department of grant recipients. Priority 32 shall be given to applicants who (i) commit to pursuing models of local governance that promote the successful mixed delivery of preschool services, (ii) compare classroom and child outcomes among 33 34 teachers with different credentials and qualifications, (iii) utilize incentives to encourage participation, 35 and (iv) utilize strategic assessment to discern student outcomes. Applicants may request and the Board 36 shall grant such waivers of regulations as are required to permit greater flexibility for the 37 mixed-delivery preschool services system.

38 F. Each grant recipient shall annually report on its mixed-delivery preschool services system to the 39 Chairmen of the House Committees on Education and Appropriations and the Senate Committees on 40 Finance and Education and Health.

2. That six two-year grants shall be awarded under the Mixed-Delivery Preschool Grant Program 41 in each year of the 2016-2018 biennium. 42

3. That the provisions of this act shall expire on July 1, 2019. 43

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
