That § 33.2-209 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 33.2-209. Construction and maintenance contracts and activities related to passenger and 11 12 freight rail and public transportation. A. The Board shall have the power and duty to let all contracts to be administered by the 13 14 Department of Transportation or the Department of Rail and Public Transportation for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of the highways comprising systems of state highways and for all 15 activities related to passenger and freight rail and public transportation in excess of \$5 million. The 16 Commissioner of Highways has authority to let all Department of Transportation-administered contracts 17 18 for highway construction, maintenance, and improvements up to \$5 million in value. The Director of the 19 Department of Rail and Public Transportation has the authority to let contracts for passenger and freight 20 rail and public transportation improvements up to \$5 million in value. The Commissioner of Highways 21 is authorized to enter into agreements with localities, authorities, and transportation districts to 22 administer projects and to allow those localities, authorities, and transportation districts to let contracts 23 with no limit on contract value and without prior concurrence of the Commissioner of Highways or the 24 Board for highway construction, maintenance, and improvements within their jurisdictions, in accordance 25 with those provisions of this Code providing those localities, authorities, and transportation districts the ability to let such contracts. The Director of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation is 26 27 authorized to enter into agreements with localities, authorities, and transportation districts to administer 28 projects and to allow those localities, authorities, and transportation districts to let contracts with no limit 29 on contract value and without prior concurrence of the Director of the Department of Rail and Public 30 Transportation or the Board for passenger and freight rail and public transportation activities within their 31 jurisdictions, in accordance with those provisions of this Code providing those localities, authorities, and transportation districts the ability to let such contracts. The Commissioner of Highways and the Director 32 33 of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation shall report on their respective transportation 34 contracting activities at least quarterly to the Board. 35 B. The Board may award contracts for the construction of transportation projects on a design-build 36 basis. These contracts may be awarded after a written determination is made by the Commissioner of 37 Highways or the Director of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation, pursuant to objective 38 criteria previously adopted by the Board regarding the use of design-build, that delivery of the projects 39 must be expedited and that it is not in the public interest to comply with the design and construction 40 contracting procedures normally followed. Such objective criteria shall include requirements for 41 prequalification of contractors and competitive bidding processes. These contracts shall be of such size and scope to encourage maximum competition and participation by agency prequalified and otherwise 42 qualified contractors. Such determination shall be retained for public inspection in the official records of 43 the Department of Transportation or the Department of Rail and Public Transportation, as the case may 44 be, and shall include a description of the nature and scope of the project and the reasons for the 45 46 Commissioner's or the Director's determination that awarding a design-build contract will best serve the public interest. A Request for Proposal for transportation projects to be delivered on a design-build 47 basis pursuant to this section may allow for the submission and consideration of alternative technical 48

49 concepts in accordance with the procedures set forth in such Request for Proposal. [Alternative
 50 technical concepts may supplement but not substitute the base proposal called for in a Request for
 51 Proposal.] The provisions of this section shall supersede contrary provisions of subsection D of
 52 § 2.2-4303 and § 2.2-4306.

For the purposes of this subsection, "alternative technical concepts" means proposed changes to
agency-supplied base design configurations, project scope, design, or construction criteria that provide a
solution that is equal to or better than the requirements in the Request for Proposal.

56 C. The Board may award contracts for the provision of equipment, materials, and supplies to be used
57 in construction of transportation projects on a fixed-price basis. Any such contract may provide that the
58 price to be paid for the provision of equipment, materials, and supplies to be furnished in connection

- 59 with the projects shall not be increased but shall remain fixed until completion of the projects specified
- in the contracts. Material components of any such contract for annual and multiyear programs, including maintenance, may be fixed at the outset of the projects and until completion based on best achievable

62 prices.
