4	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 23-9.8:2, relating to the State
5	Council of Higher Education for Virginia; open educational resources.

10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 23-9.8:2 as follows:
12	§ 23-9.8:2. Open educational resources; Open Educational Resources Grant Fund and Program
13	established.
14	A. As used in this section:
15	"Council" means the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia.
16 17	"Fund" means the Open Educational Resources Grant Fund. "Open educational resources" means teaching, learning, and research resources that:
18	1. Reside in the public domain or that have been released under an intellectual property license that
19	permits their free use and repurposing by others; and
20	2. Conform to the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) and to any
21	additional accessibility standards established by the Council.
22	"Program" means the Open Educational Resources Grant Program.
23	B. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Open
24 25	Educational Resources Grant Fund, referred to in this section as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. All gifts, grants, or donations from public or private
$\frac{23}{26}$	sources shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the
27	Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including
28	interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in
29	the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purposes of providing grants under the Open
30	Educational Resources Grant Program. Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by
31 32	the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the director of the Council.
33	C. The Open Educational Resources Grant Program is established within the Council and in
34	collaboration with each public institution of higher education to encourage the use of low-cost or
35	no-cost open educational resources at such institutions.
36	D. The Council shall award grants under the Program through the Fund on a competitive basis to
37	public institutions of higher education, giving priority to applications that propose to:
38 39	1. Adapt or otherwise make use of existing open educational resources; 2. Leverage grants awarded under this section with matching private funds or other resources;
<b>40</b>	3. Utilize students in the design or production of open educational resource materials;
41	4. Involve coordinated activities between two or more public institutions of higher education;
42	5. Focus on high-enrollment courses;
43	6. Address a need not currently met by existing available open educational resources; and
44 45	7. Assist in convening faculty from public institutions of higher education to promote the use of open
45 46	educational resources in higher education. E. All resources created or revised with grant funds received pursuant to the Program shall be
47	openly licensed and shared with the public through an existing or new open educational resources
48	repository.
<b>49</b>	F. No later than June 30, 2017, the Council, in coordination with each public institution of higher
50	education, shall identify open educational resources that have undergone a peer-review process and can
51 52	be made available to each public institution of higher education and be adopted at each such institution as the primary instructional material for at least 15 high-enrollment courses in general education
52 53	disciplines for which the course credit is transferrable among each public institution of higher
54	education.
55	G. Each public institution of higher education awarded grants under the program shall, after an
56	appropriate pilot period of successful implementation, prominently designate grant-funded courses whose
57 59	course materials consist exclusively of open educational resources or other low-cost or no-cost course
58	materials (i) in the published course descriptions on the institution's website or otherwise provided to

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- students at the time of course registration and on the campus bookstore course materials list that is provided for the course or (ii) through other methods or processes deemed appropriate by the institution and approved by the Council. 59
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- 2. That an emergency exists and this act is in force from its passage. 62
