10	laboratory remediators.
11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That §§ 54.1-300, 54.1-500, 54.1-500.1, 54.1-501, 54.1-503, and 54.1-516 of the Code of Virginia
13	are amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 5 of Title 541 an article numbered 4 consisting of costions numbered 541 517 (541 5177 and
14 15	Title 54.1 an article numbered 4, consisting of sections numbered 54.1-517.6, 54.1-517.7, and 54.1-517.8, as follows:
15 16	§ 54.1-300. Definitions.
17	As used in this chapter unless the context requires a different meaning:
18	"Board" means the Board for Professional and Occupational Regulation.
19	"Certification" means the process whereby the Department or any regulatory board issues a certificate
20	on behalf of the Commonwealth to a person certifying that he possesses the character and minimum
21 22	skills to engage properly in his profession or occupation. "Department" means the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation.
$\frac{22}{23}$	"Director" means the Director of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation.
24	"Inspection" means a method of regulation whereby a state agency periodically examines the
25	activities and premises of practitioners of an occupation or profession to ascertain if the practitioner is
26	carrying out his profession or occupation in a manner consistent with the public health, safety and
27	welfare.
28 29	"Licensure" means a method of regulation whereby the Commonwealth, through the issuance of a license, authorizes a person possessing the character and minimum skills to engage in the practice of a
30	profession or occupation that is unlawful to practice without a license.
31	"Registration" means a method of regulation whereby any practitioner of a profession or occupation
32	may be required to submit information concerning the location, nature and operation of his practice.
33	"Regulatory board" means the Auctioneers Board, Board for Architects, Professional Engineers, Land
34	Surveyors, Certified Interior Designers and Landscape Architects, Board for Barbers and Cosmetology,
35 36	Board for Branch Pilots, Board for Contractors, Board for Hearing Aid Specialists and Opticians, Board for Professional Soil Scientists, Wetland Professionals, and Geologists, Board for Waste Management
37	Facility Operators, Board for Waterworks and Wastewater Works Operators and Onsite Sewage System

44	§ 54.1-500. Definitions.
45	As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:
46	"Accredited asbestos training program" means a training program that has been approved by the
47	Board to provide training for individuals to engage in asbestos abatement, conduct asbestos inspections,
48 49	prepare management plans, prepare project designs or act as project monitors. "Accredited lead training program" means a training program that has been approved by the Board to
5 0	provide training for individuals to engage in lead-based paint activities.
51	"Accredited renovation training program" means a training program that has been approved by the
52	Board to provide training for individuals to engage in renovation or dust clearance sampling.
53	"Asbestos" means the asbestiform varieties of actinolite, amosite, anthophyllite, chrysotile, crocidolite,
54 55	and tremolite. "Ashestos analytical laboratory license" means an authorization issued by the Board to perform phase.
55 56	"Asbestos analytical laboratory license" means an authorization issued by the Board to perform phase contrast, polarized light, or transmission electron microscopy on material known or suspected to contain
57	asbestos.
58	"Asbestos contractor's license" means an authorization issued by the Board permitting a person to
59	enter into contracts to perform an asbestos abatement project.

60 "Asbestos-containing materials" or "ACM" means any material or product which contains more than61 1.0 percent asbestos or such other percentage as established by EPA final rule.

62 "Asbestos inspector's license" means an authorization issued by the Board permitting a person to
 63 perform on-site investigations to identify, classify, record, sample, test and prioritize by exposure
 64 potential asbestos-containing materials.

65 "Asbestos management plan" means a program designed to control or abate any potential risk to 66 human health from asbestos.

67 "Asbestos management planner's license" means an authorization issued by the Board permitting a68 person to develop or alter an asbestos management plan.

"Asbestos project" or "asbestos abatement project" means an activity involving job set-up for
containment, removal, encapsulation, enclosure, encasement, renovation, repair, construction or alteration
of an asbestos-containing material. An asbestos project or asbestos abatement project shall not include
nonfriable asbestos-containing roofing, flooring and siding materials which when installed, encapsulated
or removed do not become friable.

"Asbestos project designer's license" means an authorization issued by the Board permitting a personto design an asbestos abatement project.

"Asbestos project monitor's license" means an authorization issued by the Board permitting a person
 to monitor an asbestos project, subject to Department regulations.

78 "Asbestos supervisor" means any person so designated by an asbestos contractor who provides79 on-site supervision and direction to the workers engaged in asbestos projects.

80 "Asbestos worker's license" means an authorization issued by the Board permitting an individual to work on an asbestos project.

82 "Board" means the Virginia Board for Asbestos, Lead, and Home Inspectors, and Clandestine Drug
 83 Laboratory Remediators.

84 "Certified home inspection" means any inspection of a residential building for compensation
85 conducted by a certified home inspector. A certified home inspection shall include a written evaluation
86 of the readily accessible components of a residential building, including heating, cooling, plumbing, and
87 electrical systems; structural components; foundation; roof; masonry structure; exterior and interior
88 components; and other related residential housing components. A certified home inspection may be
89 limited in scope as provided in a home inspection contract, provided such contract is not inconsistent
90 with the provisions of this chapter or the regulations of the Board.

91 "Certified home inspector" means a person who meets the criteria of education, experience, and 92 testing required by this chapter and regulations of the Board and who has been certified by the Board.

"Clandestine drug laboratory" means any area where the illegal manufacture, processing, cooking,
disposal, or storage of controlled substances, or their immediate precursors, has been conducted or
attempted, and all proximate areas that are likely to be contaminated as a result of such manufacture,
processing, cooking, disposal, or storage.

97 "Clandestine drug laboratory remediation" means the cleaning of buildings, structures, or other sites
98 used to illegally produce controlled substances, the removal of contaminated building material or
99 furnishings that are unsalvageable, and other activities, including sanitation protocols, that are intended
100 to render such building, structures, or sites habitable or safe from contamination.

101 "Clandestine drug laboratory remediator" means an individual who has been licensed by the Board
 102 to enter into contracts to perform clandestine drug laboratory remediation.

103 "Controlled substance" means the same as that term is defined in § 54.1-3401.

"Dust clearance sampling" means an on-site collection of dust or other debris that is present after the
 completion of a renovation to determine the presence of lead-based paint hazards and the provisions of a
 report explaining the results.

107 "Dust sampling technician" means an individual licensed by the Board to perform dust clearance 108 sampling.

"Friable" means that the material when dry may be crumbled, pulverized, or reduced to powder by
hand pressure and includes previously nonfriable material after such previously nonfriable material
becomes damaged to the extent that when dry it may be crumbled, pulverized, or reduced to powder by
hand pressure.

"Lead abatement" means any measure or set of measures designed to permanently eliminatelead-based paint hazards, including lead-contaminated dust or soil.

115 "Lead-based paint" means paint or other surface coatings that contain lead equal to or in excess of 116 1.0 milligrams per square centimeter or more than 0.5 percent by weight.

"Lead-based paint activity" means lead inspection, lead risk assessment, lead project design and
abatement of lead-based paint and lead-based paint hazards, including lead-contaminated dust and
lead-contaminated soil.

"Lead-contaminated dust" means surface dust that contains an area or mass concentration of lead ator in excess of levels identified by the Environmental Protection Agency pursuant to § 403 of TSCA (15)

122 U.S.C. § 2683).

"Lead-contaminated soil" means bare soil that contains lead at or in excess of levels identified by theEnvironmental Protection Agency.

"Lead contractor" means a person who has met the Board's requirements and has been issued alicense by the Board to enter into contracts to perform lead abatements.

127 "Lead inspection" means a surface-by-surface investigation to determine the presence of lead-based128 paint and the provisions of a report explaining the results of the investigation.

129 "Lead inspector" means an individual who has been licensed by the Board to conduct lead 130 inspections and abatement clearance testing.

"Lead project design" means any descriptive form written as instructions or drafted as a plan
 describing the construction or setting up of a lead abatement project area and the work practices to be
 utilized during the lead abatement project.

"Lead project designer" means an individual who has been licensed by the Board to prepare leadproject designs.

"Lead risk assessment" means (i) an on-site investigation to determine the existence, nature, severity
and location of lead-based paint hazards and (ii) the provision of a report by the individual or the firm
conducting the risk assessment, explaining the results of the investigation and options for reducing
lead-based paint hazards.

140 "Lead risk assessor" means an individual who has been licensed by the Board to conduct lead 141 inspections, lead risk assessments and abatement clearance testing.

142 "Lead supervisor" means an individual who has been licensed by the Board to supervise lead143 abatements.

144 "Lead worker" or "lead abatement worker" means an individual who has been licensed by the Board145 to perform lead abatement.

146 "Person" means a corporation, partnership, sole proprietorship, firm, enterprise, franchise, association147 or any other individual or entity.

148 "Principal instructor" means the individual who has the primary responsibility for organizing and
 149 teaching an accredited asbestos training program, an accredited lead training program, an accredited
 150 renovation training program, or any combination thereof.

151 "Renovation" means the modification of any existing structure or portion thereof, for compensation, 152 that results in the disturbance of painted surfaces, unless that activity is performed as a part of a lead 153 abatement. As used in this definition, "compensation" shall include the receipt of (i) pay for work 154 performed, such as that paid to contractors and subcontractors; (ii) wages, including but not limited to 155 those paid to employees of contractors, building owners, property management companies, 156 child-occupied facilities operators, state and local government agencies, and nonprofit organizations; and 157 (iii) rent for housing constructed before January 1, 1978, or child-occupied facilities in public or 158 commercial building space.

159 "Renovation contractor" means a person who has met the Board's requirements and has been issued a160 license by the Board to conduct renovations.

161 "Renovator" means an individual who has been issued a license by the Board to perform renovations162 or to direct others who perform renovations.

163 "Residential building" means, for the purposes of home inspection, a structure consisting of one to 164 four dwelling units used or occupied, or intended to be used or occupied, for residential purposes.

"Training manager" means the individual responsible for administering a training program and
 monitoring the performance of instructors for an accredited asbestos training, accredited lead training
 program or accredited renovation training program.

168 § 54.1-500.1. Virginia Board for Asbestos, Lead, Home Inspectors, and *Clandestine Drug* 169 Laboratory Remediators; membership; meetings; quorum.

170 The Virginia Board for Asbestos, Lead, and Home Inspectors, and Clandestine Drug Laboratory 171 Remediators shall be appointed by the Governor and composed of 14 15 members as follows: one shall 172 be a representative of a Virginia-licensed asbestos contractor, one shall be a representative of a 173 Virginia-licensed lead contractor, one shall be a representative of a Virginia-licensed renovation 174 contractor, one shall be either a Virginia-licensed asbestos inspector or project monitor, one shall be a 175 Virginia-licensed lead risk assessor, one shall be a Virginia-licensed renovator, one shall be a 176 Virginia-licensed dust sampling technician, one shall be a representative of a Virginia-licensed asbestos 177 analytical laboratory, one shall be a representative of an asbestos, lead, or renovation training program, 178 one shall be a member of the Board for Contractors, two shall be certified home inspectors, one shall be 179 a licensed clandestine drug laboratory remediator, and two shall be citizen members. After initial 180 staggered terms, the terms of members of the Board shall be four years, except that vacancies may be 181 filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. The two home inspector members appointed to the Board shall have practiced as home inspectors for at least five consecutive years immediately prior to 182

183 appointment. The renovation contractor, renovator, and dust sampling technician members appointed to 184 the board shall have practiced respectively as a renovation contractor, renovator, or dust sampling 185 technician for at least five consecutive years prior to appointment. The clandestine drug laboratory 186 remediator member appointed to the Board shall have practiced as a clandestine drug laboratory 187 remediator for at least three consecutive years immediately prior to appointment.

188 The Board shall meet at least once each year and other such times as it deems necessary. The Board 189 shall elect from its membership a chairman and a vice-chairman to serve for a period of one year. Eight 190 members of the Board shall constitute a quorum. The Board is vested with the powers and duties 191 necessary to execute the purposes of this chapter.

192 § 54.1-501. Powers and duties of the Board. 193

The Board shall administer and enforce this chapter. The Board shall:

1. Promulgate regulations necessary to carry out the requirements of this chapter in accordance with 194 the provisions of the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) to include but not be limited to the 195 prescription of fees, procedures, and qualifications for the issuance and renewal of asbestos, lead, and 196 197 renovation licenses, and governing conflicts of interest among various categories of asbestos, lead, and 198 renovation licenses;

199 2. Approve the criteria for accredited asbestos training programs, accredited lead training programs, 200 accredited renovation training programs, training managers, and principal instructors;

201 3. Approve accredited asbestos training programs, accredited lead training programs, accredited 202 renovation training programs, examinations and the grading system for testing applicants for asbestos, 203 lead, and renovation licensure;

204 4. Promulgate regulations governing the licensing of and establishing performance criteria applicable 205 to asbestos analytical laboratories;

206 5. Promulgate regulations governing the functions and duties of project monitors on asbestos projects, 207 circumstances in which project monitors shall be required for asbestos projects, and training 208 requirements for project monitors;

209 6. Promulgate, in accordance with the Administrative Process Act, regulations necessary to establish 210 procedures and requirements for the: (i) approval of accredited lead training programs, (ii) licensure of 211 individuals and firms to engage in lead-based paint activities, and (iii) establishment of standards for 212 performing lead-based paint activities consistent with the Residential Lead-based Paint Hazard Reduction 213 Act and United States Environmental Protection Agency regulations. If the United States Environmental 214 Protection Agency (EPA) has adopted, prior to the promulgation of any related regulations by the Board, 215 any final regulations relating to lead-based paint activities, then the related regulations of the Board shall 216 not be more stringent than the EPA regulations in effect as of the date of such promulgation. In addition, if the EPA shall have outstanding any proposed regulations relating to lead-based paint 217 218 activities (other than as amendments to existing EPA regulations), as of the date of promulgation of any 219 related regulations by the Board, then the related regulations of the Board shall not be more stringent 220 than the proposed EPA regulations. In the event that the EPA shall adopt any final regulations 221 subsequent to the promulgation by the Board of related regulations, then the Board shall, as soon as 222 practicable, amend its existing regulations so as to be not more stringent than such EPA regulations;

223 7. Promulgate regulations for certification of home inspectors not inconsistent with this chapter 224 regarding the professional qualifications of home inspectors applicants, the requirements necessary for 225 passing home inspectors examinations in whole or in part, the proper conduct of its examinations, the 226 proper conduct of the home inspectors certified by the Board, the implementation of exemptions from 227 certifications requirements, and the proper discharge of its duties; and

228 8. Promulgate, in accordance with the Administrative Process Act, regulations necessary to establish 229 procedures and requirements for the (i) approval of accredited renovation training programs, (ii) 230 licensure of individuals and firms to engage in renovation, and (iii) establishment of standards for 231 performing renovation consistent with the Residential Lead-based Paint Hazard Reduction Act and 232 United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations. Such regulations of the Board shall be consistent with the EPA Lead Renovation, Repair, and Painting Program final rule; and 233

234 9. Promulgate regulations for licensing of clandestine drug laboratory remediators not inconsistent 235 with this chapter regarding the professional qualifications of such applicants, the requirements necessary for passing applicable examinations in whole or in part, the proper conduct of its 236 237 examinations, the proper conduct of clandestine drug laboratory remediators licensed by the Board, the 238 implementation of exemptions from licensure requirements, and the proper discharge of its duties. 239

§ 54.1-503. Licenses required.

240 A. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not have an asbestos contractor's license to contract 241 with another person, for compensation, to carry out an asbestos project or to perform any work on an asbestos project. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not have an asbestos project designer's license to develop an asbestos project design. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not have an 242 243 244 asbestos inspector's license to conduct an asbestos inspection. It shall be unlawful for any person who

does not have an asbestos management planner's license to develop an asbestos management plan. It 245 246 shall be unlawful for any person who does not have a license as an asbestos project monitor to act as 247 project monitor on an asbestos project.

248 B. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not possess a valid asbestos analytical laboratory 249 license issued by the Board to communicate the findings of an analysis, verbally or in writing, for a fee, 250 performed on material known or suspected to contain asbestos for the purpose of determining the 251 presence or absence of asbestos.

252 C. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not possess a license as a lead contractor to contract 253 with another person to perform lead abatement activities or to perform any lead abatement activity or 254 work on a lead abatement project. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not possess a lead 255 supervisor's license to act as a lead supervisor on a lead abatement project. It shall be unlawful for any 256 person who does not possess a lead worker's license to act as a lead worker on a lead abatement project. 257 It shall be unlawful for any person who does not possess a lead project designer's license to develop a 258 lead project design. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not possess a lead inspector's license 259 to conduct a lead inspection. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not possess a lead risk assessor's license to conduct a lead risk assessment. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not 260 261 possess a lead inspector's or lead risk assessor's license to conduct lead abatement clearance testing.

262 D. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not possess a license as a renovation contractor to 263 perform renovation. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not possess a renovator's license to 264 perform or direct others to perform renovation. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not possess 265 a dust sampling technician's license to perform dust clearance sampling.

266 E. (Effective July 1, 2016) It shall be unlawful for any person who is not a certified home inspector pursuant to this chapter and who has not successfully completed the training module required by 267 268 § 54.1-517.2 to conduct a home inspection on any new residential structure.

269 F. It shall be unlawful for any person who does not possess a license as a clandestine drug 270 laboratory remediator to perform clandestine drug laboratory remediation. 271

§ 54.1-516. Disciplinary actions.

272 A. The Board may reprimand, fine, suspend, or revoke (i) the license of a lead contractor, lead 273 inspector, lead risk assessor, lead project designer, lead supervisor, lead worker, asbestos contractor, 274 asbestos supervisor, asbestos inspector, asbestos analytical laboratory, asbestos management planner, 275 asbestos project designer, asbestos project monitor, asbestos worker, renovator, dust sampling technician, 276 or renovation contractor or (ii) the approval of an accredited asbestos training program, accredited lead 277 training program, accredited renovation training program, training manager or principal instructor, if the 278 licensee or approved person or program: 279

1. Fraudulently or deceptively obtains or attempts to obtain a license or approval;

280 2. Fails at any time to meet the qualifications for a license or approval or to comply with the 281 requirements of this chapter or any regulation adopted by the Board; or

282 3. Fails to meet any applicable federal or state standard when performing an asbestos project or 283 service, performing lead-based paint activities, or performing renovations.

284 B. The Board may reprimand, fine, suspend, or revoke the license of, (i) any asbestos contractor who 285 employs or permits an individual without an asbestos supervisor's or worker's license to work on an 286 asbestos project, (ii) any lead contractor who employs or permits an individual without a lead 287 supervisor's or lead worker's license to work on a lead abatement project, or (iii) any renovation 288 contractor who employs or permits an individual without a renovator's license to perform or to direct 289 others who perform renovations. 290

C. The Board may reprimand, fine, suspend, or revoke the certification of a home inspector.

291 D. The Board may reprimand, fine, suspend, or revoke the license of a clandestine drug laboratory 292 remediator. 293

Article 4.

Clandestine Drug Laboratory Remediators.

§ 54.1-517.6. License required.

294

295

296 No individual shall perform or offer to perform clandestine drug laboratory remediation without a 297 valid license issued by the Board.

298 § 54.1-517.7. Requirements for licensure.

299 A. The Board may issue a license to perform clandestine drug laboratory remediation in the 300 Commonwealth to any applicant who has submitted satisfactory evidence that he has successfully:

- 301 1. Completed any educational requirements as required by the Board;
- 302 2. Completed any experience requirements as required by the Board; and
- 303 3. Passed any written or electronic examination offered or approved by the Board.

304 B. The Board may issue a license to perform clandestine drug laboratory remediation to any 305 applicant who is certified by a national or state professional clandestine drug laboratory remediators 306 association that is approved by the Board, provided that the requirements for the applicant's class of membership in such association are equal to or exceed the requirements established by the Board for all

307 308 applicants.

309 § 54.1-517.8. Award of contracts by state agencies and political subdivisions.

310 No state agency or political subdivision shall award a contract in connection with a clandestine drug

311 laboratory remediation to a person who does not hold a clandestine drug laboratory remediator's

312 license at the time the bid is submitted unless the general contractor to whom the contract is awarded

313 will be contractually committed to have all clandestine drug laboratory remediation-related work 314 performed by its own subcontractors who are appropriately licensed as clandestine drug laboratory

315 remediators pursuant to this article.

2. That the provisions of this act shall become effective on July 1, 2018. 316

3. That the Virginia Board for Asbestos, Lead, and Home Inspectors shall promulgate regulations 317

- to implement the provisions of this act to be effective no later than July 1, 2018. The Board's 318
- initial adoption of regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this act shall be exempt from the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq. of the Code of Virginia), except that the 319
- 320

Board shall provide an opportunity for public comment on the regulations prior to adoption. 321
