That §§ 2.2-2101, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, and 2.2-3711 of the 12 Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding 13 in Chapter 24 of Title 2.2 an article numbered 26, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-2484 14 15 through 2.2-2490, as follows: § 2.2-2101. (Effective until July 1, 2017) Prohibition against service by legislators on boards, 16 17 commissions, and councils within the executive branch; exceptions. Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils 18 19 within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs 20 established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the 21 appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the 22 23 executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the 24 General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another 25 person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position. (Effective July 1, 2017) Prohibition against service by legislators on boards, 51 commissions, and councils within the executive branch; exceptions.

Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils 52 53 within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs 54 established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and 55 councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the 56 executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the 57 General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another 58 59 person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position.

Article 26.

# Virginia Growth and Opportunity Act.

### § 2.2-2484. Definitions.

**86** As used in this article, unless the context requires a different meaning:

- 87 "Board" means the Virginia Growth and Opportunity Board.
- 88 "Department" means the Department of Housing and Community Development.
- **89** *"Fund" means the Virginia Growth and Opportunity Fund.*
- 90 "Qualifying region" means a region with a regional council.

91 "Region" means one or more planning districts or otherwise defined areas designated as a region by
 92 the Board for the purpose of administering grants provided pursuant to this article.

"Regional activity" means an economic or workforce development-focused collaborative project or
program that is (i) endorsed by a regional council, (ii) consistent with the economic growth and
diversification plan developed by the regional council, and (iii) carried out, performed on behalf of, or
contracted for by two or more localities, political subdivisions, or public bodies corporate and politic
within a region.

98 "Regional council" means a public body certified by the Board as eligible to receive grants pursuant
99 to this article and that is supported by or affiliated with an existing or newly established organization
100 that engages in collaborative planning or execution of economic or workforce development activities
101 within a region.

## § 2.2-2485. Virginia Growth and Opportunity Board; membership; terms; compensation.

A. The Virginia Growth and Opportunity Board is established as a policy board in the executive
 branch of state government. The purpose of the Board is to promote collaborative regional economic
 and workforce development opportunities and activities.

106 B. The Board shall have a total membership of 24 members that shall consist of seven legislative members, 14 nonlegislative citizen members, and three ex officio members. Members shall be appointed 107 108 as follows: four members of the House of Delegates, consisting of the Chairman of the House 109 Committee on Appropriations and three members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; 110 three members of the Senate, consisting of the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Finance and two 111 members appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; two nonlegislative citizen members to be 112 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates, who shall be from different regions of the Commonwealth and have significant private-sector business experience; two nonlegislative citizen 113 114 members to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules, who shall be from different regions of the Commonwealth and have significant private-sector business experience; two nonlegislative citizen 115 116 members to be appointed by the Governor, who shall be from different regions of the Commonwealth and have significant private-sector business experience; and eight nonlegislative citizen members to be 117 118 appointed by the Governor, subject to the confirmation of the General Assembly, who shall have significant private-sector business experience. Of the Governor's nonlegislative citizen appointments 119 120 subject to General Assembly confirmation, no more than two appointees may be from any one region of the Commonwealth. The Speaker of the House of Delegates and the Senate Committee on Rules shall 121

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submit a list of recommended nonlegislative citizens with significant private-sector business experience
for the Governor to consider in making his nonlegislative citizen appointments. The Governor shall also
appoint three Secretaries from the following, who shall serve ex officio with voting privileges: the
Secretary of Agriculture and Forestry, the Secretary of Commerce and Trade, the Secretary of
Education, the Secretary of Finance, and the Secretary of Technology. Nonlegislative citizen members
shall be citizens of the Commonwealth.

128 C. Legislative members and ex officio members of the Board shall serve terms coincident with their 129 terms of office. After the initial staggering of terms, nonlegislative citizen members shall be appointed 130 for a term of four years. Appointments to fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for 131 the unexpired terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. No 132 House member appointed by the Speaker of the House shall serve more than four consecutive two-year terms, no Senate member appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules shall serve more than two 133 134 consecutive four-year terms, and no nonlegislative citizen member shall serve more than two consecutive 135 four-year terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill a vacancy shall not 136 constitute a term in determining the member's eligibility for reappointment.

137 D. The Board shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership. The chairman
 138 shall be a nonlegislative citizen member. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum.

139 E. Any decision by the Board shall require an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the 140 Board.

F. Legislative members of the Board shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12, and
nonlegislative citizen members shall receive compensation as provided in § 2.2-2813 for the performance
of their duties. All members shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in
the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825.

G. Staff support and technical assistance to the Board and the Governor in carrying out the provisions of this article shall be provided by the agencies of the Secretariats of Commerce and Trade, Education, and Finance.

#### § 2.2-2486. Powers and duties of the Board.

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**149** *A. The Board shall have the power and duty to:* 

150 1. Designate regions for the purpose of administering this article;

151 2. Certify qualifying regions and regional councils, including developing and implementing guidelines
 152 or procedures for such certification;

153 *3. Develop and implement guidelines and procedures for the application for and use of any moneys* 154 *in the Fund;* 

4. Receive and assess applications for awards from the Fund submitted by regional councils and
determine the distribution, duration, and termination of awards from the Fund for uses identified in such
applications;

158 5. Advise the Governor on the allocation and prioritization of other funds available within the
159 executive branch that may be used to promote economic and workforce development on a regional
160 basis;

6. Advise the Governor on the provision of technical assistance regarding the organization and
operation of regional councils, the preparation of applications for Fund awards, and the development,
validation, and assessment of regional economic growth and diversification plans and regional activities
that receive grants from the Fund;

165 7. Provide for the collection and dissemination of information concerning local, state, national, and
166 other best practices related to collaborative regional economic and workforce development initiatives
167 that focus on private-sector growth and opportunity;

168 8. Designate advisory committees with expertise in the industries or clusters around which grant
 169 requests are proposed to assist in carrying out the Board's duties;

9. Seek independent analytical assistance from outside consultants, including post-grant assessments
 and reviews to evaluate the results and outcomes of grants awarded pursuant to this article;

172 10. Enter into contracts to provide services to regional councils to assist with prioritization, analysis,
 173 planning, and implementation of regional activities;

174 11. Submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an annual report for publication as a report 175 document as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the 176 processing of legislative documents and reports. The chairman shall submit to the Governor and the 177 General Assembly an annual executive summary of the interim activity and work of the Board no later 178 than December 1. The executive summary shall be submitted for publication as a report document as 179 provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of 180 legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website; and

181 12. Perform such other activities and functions as the Governor and General Assembly may direct.

182 B. The development of guidelines and procedures to implement the provisions of this article shall be

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183 exempt from the provisions of the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.).

§ 2.2-2487. Virginia Growth and Opportunity Fund.

185 A. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the 186 Virginia Growth and Opportunity Fund. The Fund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. 187 All moneys appropriated by the General Assembly for the Fund, and from any other sources, public or 188 private, shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the 189 Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, included 190 interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in 191 the Fund. Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on 192 warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the chairman of the Board.

193 B. Moneys in the Fund shall be used to facilitate regional collaboration on economic growth and 194 diversification. Specifically, the Fund shall be used to incentivize and encourage cooperation among business, education, and government on regional strategic economic development and workforce 195 196 development efforts. Available moneys in the Fund shall be allocated as follows:

197 1. A portion of the Fund may be used to support the initial organizational efforts of each regional 198 council, such as capacity-building activities, project prioritization, and studies and analyses related to 199 the development of an economic growth and diversification plan for the region, including identification 200 of existing and prospective gaps in education and skills within the region;

201 2. A portion shall be reserved for specific projects in each region on the basis of a region's share of 202 state population, based on population estimates made by the Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service at the University of Virginia. However, the Board may cancel such reservation in whole or in part if, in 203 204 the Board's judgment, the region has failed to establish a certified regional council or to otherwise meet 205 the qualifications for grant funding in accordance with this article; and

206  $\overline{3}$ . A portion shall be competitively awarded on the basis of expected economic impact and outcomes 207 without regard to a region's population.

208 Except for initial grants awarded pursuant to subdivision 1, no more than eight percent of any 209 grants from the Fund to a single regional council shall be used for administrative or planning purposes. 210 C. Public comment shall be received by the Board when making decisions regarding awards from the

211 Fund.

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D. No more than 90 percent of moneys in the Fund shall be awarded or allocated in any fiscal year. § 2.2-2488. Formation of regional councils.

214 A. A regional council may be established in each region identified by the Board. Regional councils 215 shall solicit, review, and recommend regional activity projects to the Board in accordance with this 216 article.

217 B. When there is no certified regional council in existence in a region, the Board may provide for 218 the formation of a regional council by designating a formation committee chairman and two members 219 from the region. The formation committee chairman shall be a nonlegislative citizen member of the 220 Board, and the chairman may designate up to two additional members of the formation committee. The 221 formation committee shall be responsible for such consultation and recruitment within the region as is 222 likely to result in certification of a regional council for the region. The formation committee chairman 223 and members may serve as officers and members of the regional council.

224 C. A regional council shall include representatives from (i) the education sector, including school 225 divisions, community colleges, and public institutions of higher education; (ii) the economic and 226 workforce development sector; (iii) local government; (iv) planning district commissions; (v) nonprofit 227 organizations; and (vi) other entities that significantly affect regional economic or workforce 228 development. Membership may include one or more nonlegislative citizen members of the Board from the region. A majority of the members of a regional council shall be from the private sector with 229 230 demonstrated significant private-sector business experience. A regional council shall be chaired by a 231 citizen member from the region with significant private-sector business experience.

D. The Board shall certify that the regional council member selection process, membership, 232 233 governance, structure, composition, and leadership meet the requirements of this article and the 234 program guidelines and procedures. The Board shall certify that the regional council has adopted 235 bylaws and taken other such steps in its organizational activities and business plan as are necessary or 236 required by Board guidelines and procedures to provide for accountability for and oversight of regional 237 activities funded from the Fund. 238

E. Public comment shall be received by the Board when certifying a regional council.

§ 2.2-2489. Award of grants to regional councils.

240 A. The Board shall establish guidelines, procedures, and objective criteria for the award and distribution of grants from the Fund to regional councils. 241

B. In order to qualify to receive grants from the Fund, a regional council shall develop an economic 242 243 growth and diversification plan to (i) promote private-sector growth and opportunity in the region; (ii) 244 identify issues of economic competitiveness for the region, including gaps in education and skills

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245 required to meet existing and prospective employer needs within the region; and (iii) outline steps that 246 the collaborating business, education, and government entities in the region will pursue to expand 247 economic opportunity, diversify the economy, and align workforce development activities with the 248 education and skills needed by employers in the region. A regional council shall review such plan not 249 less than biennially while the regional council is receiving grants from the Fund.

250 C. The Board shall only consider those regional activities endorsed by a regional council in its 251 application for grants from the Fund. For any regional activity included in a regional council's 252 application, the regional council shall identify (i) the amount of grants requested and the number of 253 years for which grants are sought; (ii) the participating business, education, and government entities 254 and their respective roles and contributions; (iii) the private, local, and other sources of nonstate 255 funding that the grant from the Fund will assist in generating, including specific amounts pledged by 256 such sources as of the application date; (iv) how the regional activity addresses the skills gaps identified 257 in the council's economic growth and diversification plan; and (v) the economic impact or other 258 outcomes that are reasonably expected to result from the proposed regional activity, including timetables 259 and means of measurement.

260 D. Regional activities eligible for grants from the Fund shall be focused on high-impact, 261 collaborative projects in a region that promote new job creation, entrepreneurship, and new capital 262 investment; leverage nonstate resources to enhance collaboration; foster research, development, and 263 commercialization activities; encourage cooperation among public bodies to reduce costs and 264 duplication of government services; and promote other economic or workforce development activities 265 consistent with this article that are authorized by the Board. The Board shall give initial priority to 266 grant proposals that promote workforce development and other activities focused on eliminating skills 267 gaps identified in a region's economic growth and diversification plan.

268 E. In determining a regional council's eligibility to receive grants from the Fund, and the amount of 269 such grants, the Board shall review and score the proposed regional activities. Scores shall be assigned 270 on the basis of predetermined criteria established by the Board in its guidelines and procedures based 271 on the following factors:

272 1. The expected economic impact or outcome of the activity, with particular emphasis on goals 273 identified in the regional council's plan for economic growth and diversification;

274 2. The fiscal resources from non-Fund sources that will be committed to the activity, including local 275 or federal funds, private contributions, and cost savings expected to be achieved through regional 276 *collaboration*;

277 3. The number and percentage of localities, including political subdivisions and bodies corporate and 278 politic, within the region that are participating in the activity, the portion of the region's population 279 represented by the participating localities, and the participation of localities that are outside of the 280 applicant region;

281 4. The compatibility with other projects, programs, or existing infrastructure in a region to maximize 282 the leverage of grants from the Fund to encourage new collaborative activities;

283 5. The expected economic impact and outcomes of the project and the complexity of the project 284 relative to the size of the economy of the region or to the population of the participating localities;

285 6. The projected cost savings and other efficiencies generated by the proposed activity, and the local 286 resources generated by collaboration that have been or will be repurposed to support the activity;

287 7. The character of the regional collaboration, including the nature and extent of the regional effort 288 involved in developing and implementing the proposed activity, the complexity of the activity, the 289 prospective impact on relations between and among the affected localities, and the prospective impact 290 on collaboration between and among business, education, and government entities in the region;

291 8. Interstate, inter-regional, and other beneficial forms of collaboration, if any, that will accompany,

292 result from, or be encouraged by the activity: 293

9. Efficiency in the administration and oversight of regional activities; and 294

10. Other factors deemed to be appropriate by the Board.

295 F. Each regional council awarded a grant from the Fund shall issue an annual report that shall 296 include, at a minimum, an assessment of the impact and outcomes from regional activities supported by 297 grants from the Fund and the region's overall progress in addressing the goals and strategies identified 298 in the region's plan for economic growth and diversification. Such assessment shall address performance 299 criteria prescribed in the program guidelines and procedures.

300 G. Subject to the provisions of § 2.2-2488 and this section, once a regional council becomes eligible 301 for grants from the Fund, the regional council may continue to apply for and receive grants from the 302 Fund to support economic activities consistent with the regional council's economic growth and 303 diversification plan in such amounts and for such duration as the Board may determine in accordance 304 with its guidelines and procedures. The Board may terminate any payments to regional councils that fail 305 to perform in accordance with this article, the Board's guidelines or procedures, or any conditions

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306 expressly agreed upon as part of a grant award, or for malfeasance. The Board may require the refund 307 of moneys from the Fund upon such termination. Grants that are terminated shall revert to the Fund for 308 distribution on an unallocated competitive basis.

309 H. In making Fund recommendations and awards, the Board may consider regional activities that 310 commenced prior to the enactment of this article, provided that the grant-funded program or project will 311 expand the scope of, or increase the number of localities participating in, such preexisting activity.

312 I. No regional council may have outstanding grant commitments of more than 25 percent of the total 313 amount appropriated to the Fund.

314 J. The year for grant payments shall be the Commonwealth's fiscal year following the calendar year 315 in which the region qualifies, with payments made annually by the Comptroller upon certification by the 316 Board. Grant amounts shall be made at the sole discretion of the Board.

317 K. Any grant awarded from the Fund to a regional council shall require matching funds at least 318 equal to the grant, provided, however, that the Board shall have the authority to reduce the match 319 requirement to no less than half of the grant upon a finding by the Board of fiscal distress or an 320 exceptional economic opportunity in a region. Such matching funds may be from local, regional, federal, 321 or private funds, but shall not include any state general or nongeneral funds, from whatever source.

L. Decisions of the Board shall be final and not subject to review or appeal.

## § 2.2-2490. Annual audit.

324 The accounts of the Board shall be audited annually by the Auditor of Public Accounts or his legally 325 authorized representatives. Copies of the annual audit shall be distributed to the Governor and to the 326 Chairmen of the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance. 327

# § 2.2-3711. Closed meetings authorized for certain limited purposes.

A. Public bodies may hold closed meetings only for the following purposes:

329 1. Discussion, consideration, or interviews of prospective candidates for employment; assignment, 330 appointment, promotion, performance, demotion, salaries, disciplining, or resignation of specific public officers, appointees, or employees of any public body; and evaluation of performance of departments or 331 332 schools of public institutions of higher education where such evaluation will necessarily involve 333 discussion of the performance of specific individuals. Any teacher shall be permitted to be present 334 during a closed meeting in which there is a discussion or consideration of a disciplinary matter that 335 involves the teacher and some student and the student involved in the matter is present, provided the 336 teacher makes a written request to be present to the presiding officer of the appropriate board.

337 2. Discussion or consideration of admission or disciplinary matters or any other matters that would 338 involve the disclosure of information contained in a scholastic record concerning any student of any 339 Virginia public institution of higher education or any state school system. However, any such student, 340 legal counsel and, if the student is a minor, the student's parents or legal guardians shall be permitted to 341 be present during the taking of testimony or presentation of evidence at a closed meeting, if such 342 student, parents, or guardians so request in writing and such request is submitted to the presiding officer 343 of the appropriate board.

344 3. Discussion or consideration of the acquisition of real property for a public purpose, or of the 345 disposition of publicly held real property, where discussion in an open meeting would adversely affect the bargaining position or negotiating strategy of the public body. 346 347

4. The protection of the privacy of individuals in personal matters not related to public business.

5. Discussion concerning a prospective business or industry or the expansion of an existing business 348 349 or industry where no previous announcement has been made of the business' or industry's interest in 350 locating or expanding its facilities in the community.

351 6. Discussion or consideration of the investment of public funds where competition or bargaining is 352 involved, where, if made public initially, the financial interest of the governmental unit would be 353 adversely affected.

354 7. Consultation with legal counsel and briefings by staff members or consultants pertaining to actual 355 or probable litigation, where such consultation or briefing in open meeting would adversely affect the 356 negotiating or litigating posture of the public body; and consultation with legal counsel employed or 357 retained by a public body regarding specific legal matters requiring the provision of legal advice by such 358 counsel. For the purposes of this subdivision, "probable litigation" means litigation that has been 359 specifically threatened or on which the public body or its legal counsel has a reasonable basis to believe 360 will be commenced by or against a known party. Nothing in this subdivision shall be construed to 361 permit the closure of a meeting merely because an attorney representing the public body is in attendance 362 or is consulted on a matter.

363 8. In the case of boards of visitors of public institutions of higher education, discussion or consideration of matters relating to gifts, bequests and fund-raising activities, and grants and contracts 364 365 for services or work to be performed by such institution. However, the terms and conditions of any such gifts, bequests, grants, and contracts made by a foreign government, a foreign legal entity, or a foreign 366 367 person and accepted by a public institution of higher education in Virginia shall be subject to public 368 disclosure upon written request to the appropriate board of visitors. For the purpose of this subdivision, 369 (i) "foreign government" means any government other than the United States government or the 370 government of a state or a political subdivision thereof; (ii) "foreign legal entity" means any legal entity 371 created under the laws of the United States or of any state thereof if a majority of the ownership of the 372 stock of such legal entity is owned by foreign governments or foreign persons or if a majority of the 373 membership of any such entity is composed of foreign persons or foreign legal entities, or any legal 374 entity created under the laws of a foreign government; and (iii) "foreign person" means any individual 375 who is not a citizen or national of the United States or a trust territory or protectorate thereof.

- 376 9. In the case of the boards of trustees of the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, the Virginia Museum
  377 of Natural History, the Jamestown-Yorktown Foundation, and The Science Museum of Virginia,
  378 discussion or consideration of matters relating to specific gifts, bequests, and grants.
- **379** 10. Discussion or consideration of honorary degrees or special awards.

380 11. Discussion or consideration of tests, examinations, or other records excluded from this chapter381 pursuant to subdivision 4 of § 2.2-3705.1.

382 12. Discussion, consideration, or review by the appropriate House or Senate committees of possible
383 disciplinary action against a member arising out of the possible inadequacy of the disclosure statement
384 filed by the member, provided the member may request in writing that the committee meeting not be
385 conducted in a closed meeting.

386 13. Discussion of strategy with respect to the negotiation of a hazardous waste siting agreement or to consider the terms, conditions, and provisions of a hazardous waste siting agreement if the governing body in open meeting finds that an open meeting will have an adverse effect upon the negotiating position of the governing body or the establishment of the terms, conditions and provisions of the siting agreement, or both. All discussions with the applicant or its representatives may be conducted in a closed meeting.

392 14. Discussion by the Governor and any economic advisory board reviewing forecasts of economic393 activity and estimating general and nongeneral fund revenues.

394 15. Discussion or consideration of medical and mental health records excluded from this chapter395 pursuant to subdivision 1 of § 2.2-3705.5.

396 16. Deliberations of the Virginia Lottery Board in a licensing appeal action conducted pursuant to
397 subsection D of § 58.1-4007 regarding the denial or revocation of a license of a lottery sales agent; and
discussion, consideration or review of Virginia Lottery matters related to proprietary lottery game
information and studies or investigations exempted from disclosure under subdivision 6 of § 2.2-3705.3
400 and subdivision 11 of § 2.2-3705.7.

401 17. Those portions of meetings by local government crime commissions where the identity of, or
402 information tending to identify, individuals providing information about crimes or criminal activities
403 under a promise of anonymity is discussed or disclosed.

404 18. Those portions of meetings in which the Board of Corrections discusses or discloses the identity
405 of, or information tending to identify, any prisoner who (i) provides information about crimes or
406 criminal activities, (ii) renders assistance in preventing the escape of another prisoner or in the
407 apprehension of an escaped prisoner, or (iii) voluntarily or at the instance of a prison official renders
408 other extraordinary services, the disclosure of which is likely to jeopardize the prisoner's life or safety.

409 19. Discussion of plans to protect public safety as it relates to terrorist activity or specific 410 cybersecurity threats or vulnerabilities and briefings by staff members, legal counsel, or law-enforcement 411 or emergency service officials concerning actions taken to respond to such matters or a related threat to 412 public safety; discussion of records excluded from this chapter pursuant to subdivision 3 or 4 of 413 § 2.2-3705.2, where discussion in an open meeting would jeopardize the safety of any person or the 414 security of any facility, building, structure, information technology system, or software program; or 415 discussion of reports or plans related to the security of any governmental facility, building or structure, 416 or the safety of persons using such facility, building or structure.

417 20. Discussion by the Board of the Virginia Retirement System, acting pursuant to § 51.1-124.30, or 418 of any local retirement system, acting pursuant to § 51.1-803, or of the Rector and Visitors of the University of Virginia, acting pursuant to § 23-76.1, or by the Board of the Virginia College Savings 419 420 Plan, acting pursuant to § 23-38.80, regarding the acquisition, holding or disposition of a security or 421 other ownership interest in an entity, where such security or ownership interest is not traded on a 422 governmentally regulated securities exchange, to the extent that such discussion (i) concerns confidential 423 analyses prepared for the Rector and Visitors of the University of Virginia, prepared by the retirement 424 system or by the Virginia College Savings Plan or provided to the retirement system or the Virginia 425 College Savings Plan under a promise of confidentiality, of the future value of such ownership interest 426 or the future financial performance of the entity, and (ii) would have an adverse effect on the value of 427 the investment to be acquired, held or disposed of by the retirement system, the Rector and Visitors of 428 the University of Virginia, or the Virginia College Savings Plan. Nothing in this subdivision shall be

429 construed to prevent the disclosure of information relating to the identity of any investment held, the430 amount invested or the present value of such investment.

431 21. Those portions of meetings in which individual child death cases are discussed by the State Child 432 Fatality Review team established pursuant to § 32.1-283.1, those portions of meetings in which 433 individual child death cases are discussed by a regional or local child fatality review team established 434 pursuant to § 32.1-283.2, those portions of meetings in which individual death cases are discussed by 435 family violence fatality review teams established pursuant to § 32.1-283.3, those portions of meetings in 436 which individual adult death cases are discussed by the state Adult Fatality Review Team established 437 pursuant to § 32.1-283.5, and those portions of meetings in which individual adult death cases are discussed by a local or regional adult fatality review team established pursuant to § 32.1-283.6. 438

22. Those portions of meetings of the University of Virginia Board of Visitors or the Eastern 439 440 Virginia Medical School Board of Visitors, as the case may be, and those portions of meetings of any 441 persons to whom management responsibilities for the University of Virginia Medical Center or Eastern 442 Virginia Medical School, as the case may be, have been delegated, in which there is discussed 443 proprietary, business-related information pertaining to the operations of the University of Virginia 444 Medical Center or Eastern Virginia Medical School, as the case may be, including business development 445 or marketing strategies and activities with existing or future joint venturers, partners, or other parties 446 with whom the University of Virginia Medical Center or Eastern Virginia Medical School, as the case 447 may be, has formed, or forms, any arrangement for the delivery of health care, if disclosure of such 448 information would adversely affect the competitive position of the Medical Center or Eastern Virginia 449 Medical School, as the case may be.

450 23. In the case of the Virginia Commonwealth University Health System Authority, discussion or consideration of any of the following: the acquisition or disposition of real or personal property where 451 disclosure would adversely affect the bargaining position or negotiating strategy of the Authority; 452 453 operational plans that could affect the value of such property, real or personal, owned or desirable for 454 ownership by the Authority; matters relating to gifts, bequests and fund-raising activities; grants and 455 contracts for services or work to be performed by the Authority; marketing or operational strategies 456 where disclosure of such strategies would adversely affect the competitive position of the Authority; 457 members of its medical and teaching staffs and qualifications for appointments thereto; and qualifications or evaluations of other employees. This exemption shall also apply when the foregoing discussions occur 458 459 at a meeting of the Virginia Commonwealth University Board of Visitors.

460 24. Those portions of the meetings of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program Committee within
461 the Department of Health Professions to the extent such discussions identify any practitioner who may
462 be, or who actually is, impaired pursuant to Chapter 25.1 (§ 54.1-2515 et seq.) of Title 54.1.

463 25. Meetings or portions of meetings of the Board of the Virginia College Savings Plan wherein
464 personal information, as defined in § 2.2-3801, which has been provided to the Board or its employees
465 by or on behalf of individuals who have requested information about, applied for, or entered into
466 prepaid tuition contracts or savings trust account agreements pursuant to Chapter 4.9 (§ 23-38.75 et seq.)
467 of Title 23 is discussed.

468 26. Discussion or consideration, by the Wireless Carrier E-911 Cost Recovery Subcommittee created
469 pursuant to § 56-484.15, of trade secrets, as defined in the Uniform Trade Secrets Act (§ 59.1-336 et
470 seq.), submitted by CMRS providers as defined in § 56-484.12, related to the provision of wireless
471 E-911 service.

472 27. Those portions of disciplinary proceedings by any regulatory board within the Department of
473 Professional and Occupational Regulation, Department of Health Professions, or the Board of
474 Accountancy conducted pursuant to § 2.2-4019 or 2.2-4020 during which the board deliberates to reach
475 a decision or meetings of health regulatory boards or conference committees of such boards to consider
476 settlement proposals in pending disciplinary actions or modifications to previously issued board orders as
477 requested by either of the parties.

478 28. Discussion or consideration of records excluded from this chapter pursuant to subdivision 11 of
479 § 2.2-3705.6 by a responsible public entity or an affected locality or public entity, as those terms are
480 defined in § 33.2-1800, or any independent review panel appointed to review information and advise the
481 responsible public entity concerning such records.

482 29. Discussion of the award of a public contract involving the expenditure of public funds, including
483 interviews of bidders or offerors, and discussion of the terms or scope of such contract, where
484 discussion in an open session would adversely affect the bargaining position or negotiating strategy of

pursuant to subdivision 17 of § 2.2-3705.6 by (i) the Commonwealth Health Research Board or (ii) the
Innovation and Entrepreneurship Investment Authority or the Research and Technology Investment

490 31. Discussion or consideration by the Commitment Review Committee of records excluded from

The working group shall conclude its work on the guidelines by October 15, 575 576 2016, but shall remain constituted and shall convene upon the call of the Chairmen to provide guidance on future changes to the guidelines and procedures or other activities related to the 577 578 implementation of this act.

579 4. That it is the intent of the General Assembly that by fiscal year 2019, the Virginia Growth and
580 Opportunity Board shall create an affiliated entity, funded wholly from non-state sources, to
581 provide staff support and to provide other services necessary for the Board to carry out the duties

582 set forth in this act.
