5	(Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Cline)
6	A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-298.1 and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section
7	numbered 22.1-298.4, relating to teacher preparation and licensure; dyslexia and other learning
8	disabilities.
9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 22.1-298.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of
11	Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-298.4 as follows:
12	§ 22.1-298.1. Regulations governing licensure.
13	A. As used in this section:
14	"Alternate route to licensure" means a nontraditional route to teacher licensure available to
15	individuals who meet the criteria specified in the regulations issued by the Board of Education.
16 17	"Industry certification credential" means an active career and technical education credential that is
17	earned by successfully completing a Board of Education-approved industry certification examination, being issued a professional license in the Commonwealth, or successfully completing an occupational
19	competency examination.
20	"Licensure by reciprocity" means a process used to issue a license to an individual coming into the
2 0 2 1	Commonwealth from another state when that individual meets certain conditions specified in the Board
22	of Education's regulations.
23	"Professional teacher's assessment" means those tests mandated for licensure as prescribed by the
24	Board of Education.
25	"Provisional license" means a nonrenewable license issued by the Board of Education for a specified
26	period of time, not to exceed three years, to an individual who may be employed by a school division in
27	the Commonwealth and who generally meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's
28	regulations for licensure, but who may need to take additional coursework or pass additional assessments
29	to be fully licensed with a renewable license.
30	"Renewable license" means a license issued by the Board of Education for five years to an individual
31	who meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's regulations.
32	B. The Board of Education shall prescribe, by regulation, the requirements for the licensure of
33 34	teachers and other school personnel required to hold a license. Such regulations shall include requirements for the denial, suspension, cancellation, revocation, and reinstatement of licensure. The
34 35	Board of Education shall revoke the license of any person for whom it has received a notice of
36	dismissal or resignation pursuant to subsection F of § 22.1-313 and, in the case of a person who is the
37	subject of a founded complaint of child abuse or neglect, after all rights to any appeal provided by
38	§ 63.2-1526 have been exhausted. Regardless of the authority of any other agency of the Commonwealth
39	to approve educational programs, only the Board of Education shall have the authority to license
40	teachers to be regularly employed by school boards, including those teachers employed to provide
41	nursing education.
42	The Board of Education shall prescribe by regulation the licensure requirements for teachers who
43	teach only online courses, as defined in § 22.1-212.23. Such license shall be valid only for teaching
44	online courses. Teachers who hold a five-year renewable license issued by the Board of Education may
45	teach online courses for which they are properly endorsed.
46	C. The Board of Education's regulations shall include requirements that a person seeking initial
47 48	licensure:
40 49	 Complete professional assessments as prescribed by the Board of Education; Complete study in attention deficit disorder;
5 0	3. Complete study in gifted education, including the use of multiple criteria to identify gifted
50 51	students; and
51 52	4. Complete study in methods of improving communication between schools and families and ways
53	of increasing family involvement in student learning at home and at school.
54	D. In addition, such regulations shall include requirements that:
55	1. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license demonstrate proficiency in the use of
56	educational technology for instruction;
57	2. Every person seeking initial licensure and persons seeking licensure renewal as teachers who have
58	not completed such study shall complete study in child abuse recognition and intervention in accordance
59	with curriculum guidelines developed by the Board of Education in consultation with the Department of

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60 Social Services that are relevant to the specific teacher licensure routes;

61 3. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall receive professional 62 development in instructional methods tailored to promote student academic progress and effective 63 preparation for the Standards of Learning end-of-course and end-of-grade assessments;

64 4. Every person seeking renewal of a license shall complete all renewal requirements, including 65 professional development in a manner prescribed by the Board, except that no person seeking renewal of 66 a license shall be required to satisfy any such requirement by completing coursework and earning credit 67 at an institution of higher education;

68 5. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall provide evidence of completion of certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use of 69 automated external defibrillators. The certification or training program shall be based on the current 70 national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and 71 the use of an automated external defibrillator, such as a program developed by the American Heart 72 Association or the American Red Cross. The Board shall provide a waiver for this requirement for any 73 74 person with a disability whose disability prohibits such person from completing the certification or 75 training;

76 6. Every person seeking licensure with an endorsement as a teacher of the blind and visually 77 impaired shall demonstrate proficiency in reading and writing Braille: and

78 7. Every teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth with an endorsement in the area of 79 career and technical education shall have an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement. If a teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth has not attained 80 an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement, the Board may, 81 upon request of the employing school division or educational agency, issue the teacher a provisional 82 83 license to allow time for the teacher to attain such credential; and

84 8. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete awareness training, 85 provided by the Department of Education, on the indicators of dyslexia, as that term is defined by the 86 Board pursuant to regulations, and the evidence-based interventions and accommodations for dyslexia.

87 E. The Board's regulations shall require that initial licensure for principals and assistant principals be 88 contingent upon passage of an assessment as prescribed by the Board.

F. The Board shall establish criteria in its regulations to effectuate the substitution of experiential 89 90 learning for coursework for those persons seeking initial licensure through an alternate route as defined 91 in Board regulations.

92 G. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board may provide for the issuance of 93 a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, pursuant to subdivision D 7 or to any 94 person who does not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure 95 imposed by law.

H. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for licensure by reciprocity:

97 1. With comparable endorsement areas for those individuals holding a valid out-of-state teaching 98 license and national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a 99 nationally recognized certification program approved by the Board of Education. The application for 100 such individuals shall require evidence of such valid licensure and national certification and shall not require official student transcripts: 101

102 2. For individuals who have obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full credentials and without 103 deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the 104 Department of Education. The individual must establish a file in the Department of Education by 105 submitting a complete application packet, which shall include official student transcripts. An assessment of basic skills as provided in § 22.1-298.2 and service requirements shall not be imposed for these 106 licensed individuals; however, other licensing assessments, as prescribed by the Board of Education, 107 108 shall be required; and 109

3. The Board may include other provisions for reciprocity in its regulations.

§ 22.1-298.4. Teacher preparation programs; learning disabilities.

111 The Department of Education shall collaborate with the State Council of Higher Education for 112 Virginia to ensure that all teacher preparation programs offered at public institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth or otherwise available convey information on the identification of 113 114 students at risk for learning disabilities, including dyslexia, other language-based learning disabilities, 115 and attention deficit disorder.

116 2. That the provisions of this act shall become effective on July 1, 2017.
