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### VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to provide for the submission to the voters of a proposed amendment to the Constitution of 3 Virginia adding in Article X a section numbered 6-B, relating to real property tax exemptions.

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### Approved

#### 6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. § 1. It shall be the duty of the officers conducting the election directed by law to be held on the 8 Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2016, at the places appointed for holding the same, to open 9 a poll and take the sense of the qualified voters upon the ratification or rejection of the proposed 10 amendment to the Constitution of Virginia, contained herein and in the joint resolution proposing such 11 amendment, to wit:

Amend the Constitution of Virginia by adding in Article X a section numbered 6-B as follows:

## **ARTICLE X**

# TAXATION AND FINANCE

Section 6-B. Property tax exemptions for spouses of certain emergency services providers.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 6, the General Assembly by general law, and within the 16 17 restrictions and conditions prescribed therein, may provide for a local option to exempt from taxation 18 the real property of the surviving spouse of any law-enforcement officer, firefighter, search and rescue 19 personnel, or emergency medical services personnel who was killed in the line of duty, who occupies the 20 real property as his or her principal place of residence. The exemption under this section shall cease if 21 the surviving spouse remarries and shall not be claimed thereafter. This exemption applies regardless of 22 whether the spouse was killed in the line of duty prior to the effective date of this section, but the exemption shall not be applicable for any period of time prior to the effective date. This exemption 23 24 applies to the surviving spouse's principal place of residence without any restriction on the spouse's 25 moving to a different principal place of residence and without any requirement that the spouse reside in 26 the Commonwealth at the time of death of the law-enforcement officer, firefighter, search and rescue 27 personnel, or emergency medical services personnel. 28

§ 2. The ballot shall contain the following question:

29 "Question: Shall the Constitution of Virginia be amended to allow the General Assembly to provide 30 an option to the localities to exempt from taxation the real property of the surviving spouse of any 31 law-enforcement officer, firefighter, search and rescue personnel, or emergency medical services 32 personnel who was killed in the line of duty, where the surviving spouse occupies the real property as 33 his or her principal place of residence and has not remarried?"

The ballots shall be prepared, distributed and voted, and the results of the election shall be ascertained and certified, in the manner prescribed by § 24.2-684 of the Code of Virginia. The State 34 35 Board of Elections shall comply with § 30-19.9 of the Code and shall cause to be sent to the electoral 36 37 boards of each county and city sufficient copies of the full text of the amendment and question 38 contained herein for the officers of election to post in each polling place on election day.

39 The electoral board of each county and city shall make out, certify and forward an abstract of the 40 votes cast for and against such proposed amendment in the manner now prescribed by law in relation to 41 votes cast in general elections.

42 The State Board of Elections shall open and canvass such abstracts and examine and report the 43 whole number of votes cast at the election for and against such amendment in the manner now prescribed by law in relation to votes cast in general elections. The State Board of Elections shall record 44 45 a certified copy of such report in its office and without delay make out and transmit to the Governor an official copy of such report, certified by it. The Governor shall without delay make proclamation of the 46 47 result, stating therein the aggregate vote for and against the amendment.

48 If a majority of those voting vote in favor of the amendment, it shall become effective on January 1, 49 2017.

50 The expenses incurred in conducting this election shall be defrayed as in the case of election of members of the General Assembly. 51

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
