11 12	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 33.2 a chapter numbered 34, consisting
14	of sections numbered 33.2-3400 through 33.2-3408, as follows:
15	CHAPTER 34.
16	DULLES GREENWAY AUTHORITY ACT.
17	§ 33.2-3400. Definitions.
18	As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:
19 20	"Authority" means the Dulles Greenway Authority created by this chapter, or if the Authority is abolished, the board, body, commission, or agency succeeding to the principal functions thereof or on
20 21	whom the powers given by this chapter to the Authority shall be conferred by law.
22	"Authority facility" means the Dulles Greenway, any interest in real estate acquired by the Authority,
23	any parking facility operated by the Authority, or any other property under the control of the Authority.
24	"Board" means the board of directors of the Dulles Greenway Authority.
25	"Dulles Greenway" means that toll road, and any appurtenances thereto, extending approximately 14
26 27	miles from Washington Dulles International Airport to the Town of Leesburg and connecting the same. The "Dulles Greenway" shall also include any parking facility.
27 28	"Parking facility" means any commuter vehicle parking facility used primarily by Dulles Greenway
2 9	commuters or Dulles Toll Road commuters, or any buildings, structures, parking areas, appurtenances,
30	or other property needed to operate such facility with such parking facility or buildings, structures,
31	parking areas, appurtenances, or other property needed to operate the facility located within one mile of
32	any part of the Dulles Greenway.
33 34	§ 33.2-3401. Dulles Greenway Authority; board of directors; membership.
34 35	A. There is hereby created a political subdivision and public body corporate and politic of the Commonwealth to be known as the Dulles Greenway Authority to be governed by a board of directors.
36	The Board shall consist of 13 voting members as follows: six members appointed by the Board of
37	Supervisors of Loudoun County, two members appointed by the Town of Leesburg, two members of the
38	House of Delegates whose districts encompass part of the Dulles Greenway appointed by the Speaker of
39	the House of Delegates, one member of the Senate, whose district encompasses part of the Dulles
40	Greenway, appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules, and two members appointed by the Governor.
41 42	All terms shall be for a period of four years. Vacancies in the membership of the Board shall be filled by the appointing authority for the unexpired term. No person shall be eligible to serve more than two
43	consecutive terms of four years. A person appointed to fill a vacancy may serve two additional
44	consecutive terms.
45	The Secretary of Transportation shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member of the Board.
46	B. The Board shall enter upon the performance of its duties and shall initially and annually elect a
47	chairman and vice-chairman from among the appointed members of the Board. The Board shall also
48 49	annually elect a secretary or secretary-treasurer who need not be a member of the Board. The chairman, or in his absence the vice-chairman, shall preside at all meetings of the Board, and in the
49 50	absence of both the chairman and the vice-chairman, the Board shall elect a chairman pro tempore who
51	shall preside at such meetings.
52	A majority of the members appointed to the Board, which majority shall include at least a majority
53	of the members appointed by the Governor, shall constitute a quorum. Decisions of the Board shall
54 55	require a quorum and shall be in accordance with voting procedures established by the Board. In all
55 56	cases, decisions of the Board shall require the affirmative vote of a majority of the votes cast by the Board members present and voting.
50 57	The members of the Board shall be entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred in attendance
58	upon meetings of the Board or while otherwise engaged in the discharge of their duties. Such expenses

59 shall be paid out of the moneys of the Authority in such manner as shall be prescribed by the Board.

60 C. The Board shall employ an Executive Director of the Authority, who shall serve at the pleasure of 61 the Board, to direct the day-to-day operations and activities of the Authority and carry out the powers

62 and duties conferred upon him by the Board. The Executive Director's compensation from the Authority63 shall be fixed by the Board and shall be payable from the moneys of the Authority. The Executive

64 Director shall employ such staff as deemed necessary and approved by the Board to carry out the 65 powers and duties of the Authority.

66 § 33.2-3402. Powers of the Authority.

67 The Authority shall have the following powers and duties:

68 1. To contract and be contracted with, to sue and be sued, and to adopt and use a seal and to alter 69 the same at its pleasure;

2. To acquire, by purchase or eminent domain, and hold interests in real or personal property
necessary for its purposes, including without limitation leasehold interests and licenses, with the title to
such interest taken in the name of the Authority;

73 3. To sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of any personal or real property or rights, easements, or 74 estates therein held by the Authority and deemed by the Authority not necessary for its purposes;

75 4. To purchase, operate, maintain, and administer the Dulles Greenway on behalf of the 76 Commonwealth using revenues from tolls and other such moneys as provided to the Authority for the 77 same;

78 5. To collect all tolls and other charges established by the Commonwealth Transportation Board for
79 the use of the Dulles Greenway or the several parts or sections thereof and to deposit the same into the
80 state treasury as soon as practicable;

81 6. To purchase, and install as needed, electronic tolling equipment or other equipment determined
82 necessary by the Authority for operating, maintaining, or administering the Dulles Greenway and to
83 purchase such equipment using such moneys as provided to the Authority for the same;

7. To make and enter into all contracts and agreements necessary or incidental to the performance
of its duties and the execution of its powers under this chapter, including contracts or agreements with
the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority for the coordinated operations, maintenance, or
administration of the Dulles Toll Road and the Dulles Greenway. Such coordinated operations may
involve the use of the same electronic tolling equipment or tolling technology;

89 8. To establish reasonable regulations for the installation, construction, maintenance, repair, renewal, relocation, or removal of pipes, mains, sewers, conduits, cables, wires, towers, poles, or other equipment or appliances, referred to herein as "public utility facilities" of the County of Loudoun, the Town of Leesburg, any public utility, any public service corporation, or any person, firm, or other 90 91 92 93 corporation rendering similar services in, on, along, over, or under the Dulles Greenway; and whenever 94 the Authority shall determine that it is necessary that any public utility facilities should be relocated or removed, the Authority may relocate or remove the public utility facilities in accordance with the 95 regulations of the Authority, and the cost and expense of such relocation or removal, including the cost 96 97 of installing the public utility facilities in a new location or locations and the cost of any lands, rights, 98 or interest in lands, or any other rights acquired to accomplish such relocation or removal, shall be 99 paid by the Authority as a part of the costs of operating and maintaining the Dulles Greenway, and the 100 owner or operator of the public utility facilities may maintain and operate the public utility facilities 101 with the necessary appurtenances in the new location or locations for as long a period and upon the 102 same terms and conditions as it had the right to maintain and operate the public utility facilities in their 103 former location or locations;

9. To establish rules and regulations for the use of any of the Authority facilities as may be
necessary or expedient in the interest of public safety with respect to the use of Authority facilities and
property under the control of the Authority;

107 10. To employ and fix the compensation of consulting engineers, attorneys, accountants,
108 superintendents, managers, or such other employees or agents as may be necessary in the discretion of
109 the Authority to operate, maintain, and administer Authority facilities;

110 11. To receive and accept from any federal agency or the Washington Metropolitan Airports
111 Authority for or in aid of the operation, maintenance, or administration of any Authority facility, and to
112 receive and accept from the Commonwealth, or from a county, city, or town or any other source, grants,
113 contributions, or other aid for or in support of such operation, maintenance, or administration, either in
114 money, property, labor, materials, or other things of value;

115 12. Issue revenue bonds to be known as Dulles Greenway Authority Toll Revenue Bonds, payable
116 from toll revenues collected or pledged, any other available sources, and earnings on all such funds.
117 Bonds issued under the provisions of this chapter shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the
118 Commonwealth or a pledge of the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth, but such bonds shall be
119 payable solely from the funds provided therefor pursuant to this chapter, from bond proceeds or
120 earnings thereon, and from any other available sources of funds. All such bonds shall state on their face

that the Commonwealth is not obligated to pay the same or the interest thereon and that the full faith 121

122 and credit of the Commonwealth are not pledged to the payment of the principal or interest of such 123 bonds.

124 13. To promote the use of any Authority facility by appropriate means, including advertising or 125 marketing, as the Authority determines appropriate and to treat the expenses thereof as operating 126 expenses of the Authority; and

127 14. To do all other acts and things necessary to carry out the powers expressly granted in this 128 chapter. 129

§ 33.2-3403. Limitations on powers of the Authority.

The Authority shall not in any way dispose of or encumber any Authority facility owned by the 130 131 Commonwealth. The Authority shall not establish or fix any toll, rent, fee, or other charge for the use or enjoyment of any Authority facility owned by the Commonwealth. 132

133 § 33.2-3404. Exemption from taxation.

134 All property of the Authority, real or personal, and all rights or interests therein and the income of 135 the Authority shall at all times be free from taxation or assessment by the Commonwealth or by any 136 municipality, county, or other political subdivision thereof. 137

§ 33.2-3405. Powers of the Commonwealth Transportation Board and the Department.

138 A. The Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized and empowered to transfer right-of-way 139 from the control of the Department to the Authority for operation and maintenance of the Dulles **140** Greenway. 141

B. The Department is authorized and empowered:

1. To enter into and perform contracts or agreements with the Authority to furnish it with surveys. 142 143 plans, specifications or other technical services, or data, the cost of which shall be reimbursed by the 144 Authority:

145 2. Subject to appropriation, to allocate to the Authority funds for purchasing, operating (including 146 the purchase of equipment), maintaining, and administering the Dulles Greenway and to pay to the 147 Authority such funds as may be or become available to the Department for such purposes; and

148 3. To transfer right-of-way from the control of the Department to the Authority for operation and 149 maintenance of the Dulles Greenway.

150 § 33.2-3406. Exemptions.

151 The Authority is hereby exempt from the provisions of the Virginia Public Procurement Act (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.) and the Virginia Personnel Act (§ 2.2-2900 et seq.) in the exercise of any of its 152 powers and duties, provided that the Board adopts procedures to ensure fairness and competitiveness in 153 154 the procurement of goods and services and the employment of personnel. The Authority shall be exempt 155 from the provisions of §§ 2.2-1124, 2.2-1131.1, 2.2-1136, 2.2-1149, 2.2-1153, 2.2-1154, and 2.2-1156. 156 These exemptions shall remain in effect so long as the Board has adopted regulations consistent with 157 the requirements of such sections and such regulations remain in effect. Regulations promulgated by the 158 Authority shall be exempt from the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.).

159 § 33.2-3407. Constitutional construction.

160 The provisions of this chapter are severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held 161 unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the decision of such court shall not affect or impair any of the other provisions of this chapter. 162

163 § 33.2-3408. Inconsistent laws inapplicable.

164 All other general or special laws inconsistent with any provision of this chapter are hereby declared 165 to be inapplicable to the provisions of this chapter and any Authority facility.
