10	WHEREAS, adoption creates a legal relationship, rights, and responsibilities between the adoptive
11	parents and the child being adopted such that the adopted child is, for all intents and purposes, the child
12	of the adoptive parents; and
13	WHEREAS, adoptions in the Commonwealth may be facilitated by local departments of social
14	services or licensed private child-placing agencies in accordance with the requirements of the Code of
15	Virginia and regulations adopted by the Department of Social Services; and
16 17	WHEREAS, a thorough investigation of an adoptive placement, including completion of a home
17 18	study, visits to the potential adoptive home, and interviews with the potential adoptive parents, is required before a child may be placed with adoptive parents; and
19	WHEREAS, the process for completion of a home study can be lengthy, and the cost of home
20	studies can be substantial; now, therefore, be it
21	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Commission on Youth be
22	directed to study the adoption home study process in the Commonwealth.
23	In conducting its study, the Commission on Youth shall review the current mutual family assessment
24	home study format and curriculum, review the process by which home studies are completed by staff of
25	local departments of social services and licensed private child-placing agencies, and consider the
26 27	potential benefits of implementation of a uniform home study format established by the Department of
27 28	Social Services for all home studies completed in the Commonwealth. Technical assistance shall be provided to the Commission on Youth by the Department of Social
20 29	Services. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission on Youth for
30	this study, upon request.
31	The Commission on Youth shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2016, and
32	for the second year by November 30, 2017, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative
33	Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first
34	day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for each year. Each executive summary shall
35	state whether the Commission on Youth intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a
36	report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The
37 38 39	executive summaries and reports shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
