 families until his well-earned retirement; he was respected by his peers in the field and was named

WHEREAS, Purcelle Brown enjoyed fellowship and worship with the community as a deacon at
Moore Street Missionary Baptist Church, where he served on the finance committee; he also worked to
enhance the quality of life of his fellow Richmond residents as a past master of East End Masonic
Lodge No. 233 and a member of the North Richmond YMCA board; and

WHEREAS, predeceased by his beloved wife, Betty, Purcelle Brown will be fondly remembered and
 greatly missed by his daughter, Laurie, and her family, and numerous other family members and friends;
 now, therefore, be it

 note with great sadness the loss of Noah Purcelle Brown, a spiritual leader and a longtime funeral
