12	potential methods of toll relief for citizens of the Commonwealth. The study should include (i) the
13	feasibility of a discount program for in-state residents on toll roads in the Commonwealth, including
14	highways owned by the state, other political subdivisions or governmental agencies, or private entities;
15	(ii) the feasibility of renegotiating agreements with private partners regarding revenue neutral options
16	for allowing in-state residents to receive discounts on roads built pursuant to agreements with private
17	partners; (iii) the feasibility of waiving transponder fees for in-state residents; (iv) rebate programs for
18 19	in-state commuters and frequent users; and (v) any other program that recognizes the prior investment
20	of Virginia taxpayers in existing infrastructure. 2. That the Department of Transportation shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated
20 21	Systems an executive summary and report of its progress in meeting the requests of this act no
22	later than the first day of the 2017 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The executive
23	summary and report shall be submitted for publication as a report document as provided in the
24	procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative
25	documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
