9 10	WITEDEAS the memory it it is for the memory and detection of arises and for the enforcement of
10 11	WHEREAS, the responsibility for the prevention and detection of crime and for the enforcement of the laws of the Commonwealth is currently spread among numerous state agencies; and
12	WHEREAS, the citizens of Virginia expect the Commonwealth to employ professional
13	law-enforcement officers who enforce the laws of the Commonwealth across the state with consistency
14	and fairness; and
15	WHEREAS, it is important to ensure that law-enforcement agencies are accountable and operating as
16	statutorily authorized; and
17 18	WHEREAS, consolidation of government functions often provides significant cost savings for the Commonwealth; and
10 19	WHEREAS, the primary state law-enforcement agency in the Commonwealth is the Department of
20	State Police; now, therefore, be it
21	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and
22	Review Commission be directed to study consolidation of all state law-enforcement agencies in the
23	executive branch under the Department of State Police.
24 25	In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall (i) identify all state
25 26	agencies in the executive branch that employ law-enforcement officers; (ii) examine the history, budget, and current activities of each law-enforcement agency or division within an executive branch agency;
27 27	(iii) determine whether those agencies or divisions are adequately and cost-effectively performing their
28	statutory law-enforcement duties; and (iv) make recommendations regarding consolidation of all
29	law-enforcement agencies in the executive branch under the Department of State Police.
30	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review
31	Commission for this study, upon request.
32 33	The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2016, and for the second year by November 30, 2017, and the chairman shall submit to
33 34	the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and
35	recommendations no later than the first day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for
36	each year. Each executive summary shall state whether the Joint Legislative Audit and Review
37	Commission intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and
38	recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summaries and reports
39 40	shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for
40 41	the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
